- Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2024/25 on 15th February 2024 with 2. the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2023/24 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnerships on 21st March 2024. The Southside Central Area Budget for 2024/25 is £85,842.35.
- A total of £53,056.29 has been committed to date to various projects serving 3. the area, leaving a balance of £32,286.06 yet to be allocated.
