

Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland's Fifth Review of Electoral Arrangements – Outcomes for Ward boundary arrangements and Community Councils – Update noted – Request to Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council.

6 With reference to the minutes of 1st March 2017 noting

- (1) the outcomes for Ward boundary arrangements and Community Councils in Glasgow following the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland's Fifth Review of Electoral Arrangements; and
- (2) that there would need to be further consideration of the number and boundaries of Area Partnerships and that this would be the subject of a further report,

there was submitted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing an update regarding the matter, advising

- (a) that following further consideration of the issue, it had been agreed to increase the number of Area Partnerships from 21 to 23, with 2 new Area Partnerships being established for the Dennistoun Ward and Partick East/Kelvindale Ward;
- (b) that there had also been some changes to some of the existing wards in the city as detailed in the report;
- (c) of the next stage in the process and the potential need for further consideration of the appointment of members to Area Partnerships, including the appointment of community representatives;
- (d) that any consideration of the above could be the subject of a report to the relevant Council Committee and would then be discussed with Community Planning Partners prior to developing appropriate proposals; and
- (e) that if any of the above steps were initiated regarding the matter then a further report would be presented to this Partnership at the appropriate time.

After consideration the Partnership

- (i) noted the report; and
- (ii) requested that when the Area Partnership review took place the Partnership would like consideration to be given to expanding the membership to a maximum of 20 members which would include a maximum of 10 community representatives.
