Garnethill	1	Cube lights which are missing from Garnethill Park reinstated & existing ones repaired.  Ideally, we would like the supply to the lights reconnected, but failing that just the light fittings reinstated, as per the original design of the park. The atmosphere the original lights generated was amazing, illuminating Garnethill for both residents and tourists.  **Amendment from Garnethill CC**  Remove all current cubic lights, store in a safe location with the others until such times as they can be repaired.  Install effective and impressive ground level lights around the perimeter of the park.	GARNETHILL PARK (ROSE STREET)  Some of the cube light fittings are still in the park, (approx. 14) but some are badly damaged.  There are also several missing, (approx. 4-6).  We believe they are in storage at Victoria Park Depot.  The park was renovated but these lights were not included in this.  Vandalised lights distract from the actual beauty and overall image of the park.  Basically, need all ground level cubic lights restored (approx. 20).

Garnethill	5	Currently Heras fencing is temporary and unsightly, difficult to secure. The community is looking for a longer-term solution to protect the oven from vandalism.  Additional info  The Bread Oven, built by members of the community in collaboration with students and staff from Glasgow School of Art and Strathclyde University Architecture Department, has been run by FROGGS for community events and in support of other community organisations' events.  The Bread oven is protected by Harris fencing, but we would like to install more attractive security fencing with lockable gates. We have considered the option of custom designed fencing, but for reliability and security, prefer to look at commercially available fencing such as the First Fence High V Mesh type. Designs will be submitted to the Planning Department, and we would follow any advice given.	ROSE STREET (END OF GARNETHILL PARK)  A secure designed fence/enclosure But still lets residents see the features of the oven through the fencing.  Must be lockable and front of fencing manoeuvrable to allow access to the oven.

Although the intervention that is needed on Union Street is probably beyond the limited funding scope of the NIF, we feel it is important that some form of civic realm improvements & potential greening on this street are
scheduled by Glasgow City Council.
