Newlands/Auldburn CC – Top 5 Priorities	
A price to replace all new railings to Auldhouse Park	Brand new railings for the entire park. Perhaps if this could be costed by length and we could then see how much we could actually get replaced within budget?
Double headed lighting for along Auldhouse Road side of Auldhouse Park	Auldhouse Road at the side of Auldhouse Park – there are street lights already in place so we just need a cost for them to be replaced with double header lights which shine into the park. I can send a map/plans of this if required?
3. Improved playground equipment with an older age range in Auldhouse Park	In the existing site of the playground Auldhouse Park, updating the old equipment and providing equipment which goes up to age 12.
4. Improved playground equipment for Newlands Park	In the existing site of the playground in Newlands Park, updating the old equipment and providing equipment which goes up to age 12.
5.Cats eyes lighting along the riverside part of Auldhouse Park	Auldhouse park riverside end (far left hand side). I can send a map/plans of this if required?

6. Exercise equipment and area for Auldhouse Park	Using any site suitable within Auldhouse Park and costing equipment similar to Queens park exercise equipment. The grassed area on the opposite side of the path from the existing play area which is level could be used to provide low key additional formal / equipped play equipment. Also the site of the former bowling greens which is flat apart from a random mounded area which I think was created by the grubbing up of the original paths around the bowling greens.
7. new benches around Auldhouse Park	All the existing benches throughout the park, by my observations, are rarely used as most are adversely affected by weeds, brambles and grass. The worst ones are at the middle gate on Auldhouse Road and on

	the curved path, all adversely affected by overgrown hedging and brambles and plant beds which have never been maintained. Additional benches could be installed on the site of the old bowling green, around the large grassed area in the middle of the park and along the middle path.
8. Raised planters x 6 for Auldhouse Park	Raised planters could be located in the vicinity of the Nether Auldhouse entrance; along the riverside path; at the Riverford Road entrance; the entrance next to 92 Auldhouse Road and along the middle path.
9. a clear up session to bring Yellow Park back up to standard.	Yellow Park (opp the top of Kintore Road
10. Bee stop planters on any bus shelter roofs	This would be for any sheltered bus stops in our area. I believe these have already been installed along Byres Road bus stops.
11. Community noticeboards x 2 for Auldhouse Park and Newlands Park	One for each park – any location close to the front gates would be suitable but once priced the Friends of groups could come up with the exact locations.
12. A separate football pitch, and basketball half court/full court? In Auldhouse Park.	Site to be determined

Newlands and Auldhouse Community Council Area - Project Scope Report

1. Double-Headed Lighting Along Auldhouse Road Side of Auldhouse Park (10 locations as per attached (SK)10)

- Installation of evenly spaced double-headed lamp posts on rear projection of new galvanised lighting columns along the Auldhouse Road boundary of Auldhouse Park to improve safety and visibility.
- LED Lighting heads to be selected based on required beam throw to illuminate the perimeter path within the park electrical supply available as these are existing lighting head locations.

2. Cats Eyes Lighting Along the Riverside Part of Auldhouse Park (Allow for 400 units installed at 3m centres)

 Installation of recessed embedded LED cats-eye lights along pathways adjacent to the river, enhancing wayfinding and safety, particularly in lowlight conditions. The lighting should be solar-powered where possible for passive illumination. Consideration should be given to weather resistance and durability (IP67 required), ensuring the units are waterproof and vandal-resistant.

3. Improved Playground Equipment with an Older Age Range in Auldhouse Park

• Expansion or enhancement of existing playground facilities to include equipment suitable for older children (8-14 years old).

4. Improved Playground Equipment for Newlands Park

 Upgrade of existing playground with new or replacement equipment based on community preferences.

5. Exercise Equipment and Area for Auldhouse Park (Allow for 8 stations)

 Installation of outdoor fitness stations, with a focus on communityrequested equipment. Equipment can be grouped in one area or spaced out along a walking loop.

6. Exercise Equipment and Area for Newlands Park (Allow for 8 stations)

• Installation of outdoor fitness stations, similar to Auldhouse Park, with a

focus on community-requested equipment. Equipment can be grouped in one area or spaced out along a walking loop.

7. Replacement of Railings at Auldhouse Park

 Taking down and removal of existing railings and gates before installation of new galvanised and powder coated or painted railings to match height profile (approx 1500mm high). This should include new pedestrian access gates. Costing should be provided per meter to allow for phased and scalable adjustments based on funding.

8. Benches with Attached Planters (x6) for Auldhouse Park

- Installation of six 316SS (Stainless steel and timber) or Cast painted seating units incorporating planter boxes.
- Allow for 6 locations with possibility of pairing single and double benches (Allow say 6 singles and 6 double benches)

9. Street Furniture Around the Area (Allow for 12 units)

- Addition of functional and decorative elements such as bicycle racks, and picnic tables.
- Allow for 6 of each

10. Bee Stop Planters on Bus Shelter Roofs (Allow for 12)


- Installation of green roof-style planters on covered bus shelters to support pollinators. Planters should be self-sustaining with drought-resistant plants and minimal maintenance requirements.
- Structural capacity assessments should be conducted to ensure bus shelters can support the added weight of soil and plants. Collaboration with local transport authorities will be required to determine the number and location of viable shelters.

11. Community Noticeboards (x2) for Auldhouse Park

- Installation of public noticeboards at key entrances of Auldhouse Park for sharing community information. Features should include weatherproof locking glass doors, space for posters, announcements, and community events, and durable materials such as metal, treated wood, or recycled plastic. Placement should be in high-footfall areas. Community consultation should determine if additional noticeboards are required for Newlands Park.
- Preferably with solar powered internal LED lighting

12. Raised Planters (X12) for Newlands and Auldhouse Park

- Installation of raised flower or vegetable beds to enhance green spaces.
 Planters could be used for community gardening projects or biodiversity-friendly planting. Locations should be identified based on space availability, sunlight exposure, and ease of maintenance. Consideration should be given to accessible planter designs for wheelchair users.
- Allow for 12 across both parks
