Background.

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13th February 2024 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2024/25 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnership on 13th March 2025. The East Centre Area Budget for 2025/26 is £114.591.00
