Cranhill bridge lighting and improvements:	
Important but underused pedestrian / cycling link across the M8 motorway joining Cranhill to Barlanark and onto Hogganfield Loch. There is no lighting to the bridge and the approaches to the bridge with the result that the community do not use the bridge. It is part of an important active travel route which would link important green spaces which offer up important recreational use for the community.	This has also been captured in Tranche 3 Ruchazie to Easterhouse Stage 1 report. Ongoing dialogue with Transport Scotland (who own the bridge) has been constructive and they would support this activity.
Cranhill Park Improvements Cranhill Park was identified within Stage 1 report. It is associated with Town Centre and Everyday Journey themes in particular. Cranhill Park is a significant greenspace that links communities. As an initial LN project, the key elements identified within Stage 1 as a result of analysis and community consultation could be included within a project that would have positive impact particularly on removing barriers to access. Cranhill park was one of three parks utilised for a light trial which was noted in the Stage 1 report and recommended at the April 2023 Environment and Liveable Neighbourhoods City Policy Committee.	 Key Elements Improve accessibility for safe, everyday journeys through improvements to pedestrian routes including removal of steps. Improve setting and facilities within the park. Improve biodiversity within the park including provision of green blue infrastructure. Greenfield Pitches Entrance and Gap Site Provide a more welcoming access into pitches and greenspace by widening entryways, particularly from Carntyne Hall Road.
