14	<p>Pavement and road at the houses requires resurfacing and repairs. There are safety issues regarding residents with mobility problems to safely enter their homes using the footpath and the road and their ability to walk to the local health centre and shops. There are several holes and broken tarmac along the length of the street that needs extensive repairs.</p> <p>Double check the priority areas already in place using the councils' roads budget.</p> <p>PRIORITY</p>	Along pavement and road length beside houses on Wallacewell Road from Standburn Road to Northgate Road	Wallacewell
15	<p>Improve lighting on Wallacewell Road by replacing single armed street light posts with double armed double armed street light posts. At present the light poles are single armed and point towards the main carriageway of Wallacewell Road leaving the houses in the Road parallel in darkness. Neighbours have been told to install their own front door light but these are not suitable to light across a path and road and are only ideal for a persons pathway. 	<p>activities, shops, medical centre, schools, church, etc. It has already seen improvements for travelling by having cycle lanes installed along its full length. However, the road has a complicated layout consisting of a dual carriageway separated by a central grass verge and at points the road widens to 4 individual carriageways at differentiating heights. The homes at the outer roads have been forgotten about during these works and lighting should have been considered to benefit everyone by lighting all sections of the road. Residents are forced to walk to their homes, park their cars and cross the road in complete darkness. These improvements would enhance safety and increase community mobility.</p> <p>Requirements – replacement of single armed light posts to double armed light posts at residential portions</p> <p>PRIORITY</p>

17	<p>Install a gate for access to Broomfield Park on Wallacewell Road. Broomfield Park at present is not safely accessible from Wallacewell Road. The creation of a gate between the entrance to Balornock Bowling Club and the bus stop would save people of the community having to walk all the way around the park fence to enter the park on Broomfield Road. The fence could easily be adapted to incorporate a simple pedestrian entrance gate, similar to the existing gates on Broomfield Road.
