**CIVIC GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1982
PRIVATE HIRE CAR'S LICENCE – SUSPENDED**

Purpose of Report:

To advise Members of the circumstances leading to the immediate suspension of Mr Inam Ur Rehman's private hire car licence (PV23635).

1 Background

- 1.1 Mr Inam Ur Rehman was granted the renewal of his private hire car licence by this Authority on 10 January 2024 for a period of three years with effect from 1 June 2023 and with an expiry date of 31 May 2026.
- 1.2 The Licensing Section received a complaint from the Chief Constable, Police Scotland dated 20 March 2025 requesting that Mr Ur Rehman's private hire car licence be suspended. A copy of the complaint will be tabled at the meeting.
- 1.3 In view of the terms of this information and in terms of paragraph 12 of Schedule 1 to the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, Mr Ur Rehman's private hire car licence was suspended on 21 March 2025 with immediate effect for a period of six weeks, since it was deemed that the continued operation of his private hire would be likely to cause a serious threat to public safety.
- 1.4 Members will be aware that following the immediate suspension of Mr Ur Rehman's licence, this Committee is required to consider whether it is necessary or appropriate to suspend or revoke the licence in terms of paragraph 11 of Schedule 1 to the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.
