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AREA BUDGET 2025/26: APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING.

Purpose of Report:

To provide the Area Partnership with details of the current position of the 2025/26 Area Budget; inform members of applications considered under Delegated Functions; and make recommendations on further applications for funding.

Introduction.

1. This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2025/26; any applications considered under Delegated Functions; and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

Background.

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13th February 2025 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2024/25 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnership on 13th March 2025. The Maryhill Area Budget for 2025/26 is £66,444.
- 3. The Area Partnership committed £6,288 from the 2025/26 Area Budget at its meeting on Friday 14th February 2025/26 and no applications had been committed under the Scheme of Delegated Functions.
- 4. Therefore, a total of £6,288 had been committed to date to various projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £60,156 yet to be allocated.

5. The following applications were ineligible for Area Partnership funding: Create your Dream – ongoing project service running costs.
