#### AREA BUDGET 2025/26: APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING.

### **Purpose of Report:**

#### Introduction.

1. This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2025/26; any applications considered under Delegated Functions; and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

# Background.

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2025 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2024/25 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnership on 13<sup>th</sup> March 2025. The North East Area Budget for 2025/26 is £88,194
- 3. The Area Partnership committed £1,000 from the 2025/26 Area Budget at its meeting on 7<sup>th</sup> February 2025 and £0 has been committed under the Scheme of Delegated Functions.
- 4. Therefore, a total of £1,000 has been committed to date to various projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £87,194 yet to be allocated.

## Ineligible applications.

5. The following applications were ineligible for Area Partnership funding:

Create Your Dream - Life Coaching & Person Centred Planning 2025 - this application was deemed ineligible as the proposal was for an on-going project and service running costs.
