### AREA BUDGET 2025/26: APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING

## **Purpose of Report:**

### Introduction.

1. This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2025/26; any applications considered under Delegated Functions; and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

# Background.

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2025 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2024/25 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnership on 13<sup>th</sup> March 2025. The Partick East Kelvindale Area Budget for 2025/26 is £60,284
- 3. The Area Partnership have committed £0 under the Scheme of Delegated Functions.
- 4. Therefore, a total of £0 has been committed to date to various projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £60,284 yet to be allocated.
