Introduction

1. This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2025/26 and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

Background

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13th February 2025 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2024/25 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnerships on 13th March 2025. The Pollokshields Area Budget for 2025/26 is £62,408
- 3. A total of £2,187.50 has been committed to date to various local groups and projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £60,220.50 yet to be allocated.

Applications dealt with under Delegated Functions

4. No applications have been dealt with under delegated functions.

Ineligible Applications

5. 1 ineligible application has been received from Wild Green Space t/a We Are Wonder. The application was deemed retrospective and therefore ineligible.

Area Budget Applications
