Introduction.

1. This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2025/26; any applications considered under Delegated Functions; and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

Background.

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13th February 2024 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2024/25 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnership on 13th March 2025. The Govan Area Budget for 2025/26 is £90,149.
- 3. The Area Partnership committed £0.00. from the 2025/26 Area Budget at its meeting on 5th February 2025/26 and £0.00 has been committed under the Scheme of Delegated Functions.
- 4. Therefore, a total of £0.00 has been committed to date to various projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £90,149. yet to be allocated.
