AREA BUDGET 2024/25: APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING

Purpose of Report:

To provide the Area Partnership with details of the current position of the 2024/25 Area Budget; inform members of applications considered under Delegated Functions; and make recommendations on further applications for funding.

Recommendations:

The Area Partnership is asked to:

- (1) note the budget position for 2024/25; and
- (2) consider the recommendations on applications received for Area Budget funding in 2024/25, as detailed in Appendix 1.

Introduction

1. This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2024/25; applications considered under Delegated Functions; and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

Background

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2023/24 on 15th February 2024 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2023/24 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnerships on 21st March 2023. The Anderston/City/Yorkhill Area Budget for 2024/25 is £62,446.05.
- 3. The Area Partnership has committed £58,286.00 from the 2024/25 Area Budget to date in 2024/25. £6,063.00 has also been committed under the Scheme of Delegated Functions (Note: Figure includes £2,620 towards Festive Lighting).
- 4. Therefore, a total of £58,286.00 has been committed to date to various projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £4,160.05 yet to be allocated.

5. Two applications have been dealt with since the last meeting of the Area Partnership under Delegated Functions. Details of the applications are provided below:

Project Ability Ltd Project Title Project Ability Family Open Day March 2025 PRN: 306/24	Project Ability will open their studios and gallery for a Family Fun Day - providing fun, family centred visual arts activities targeting families where one or more child is disabled. On Saturday 29th March 2025 from 10am-3pm, they will host a family open event, where families can come along and take part in the 3 visual arts activities on offer at their fully accessible and specially equipped studios at Trongate 103. Project Ability will provide 3 adaptable, accessible activities, each one delivered by one of their experienced and talented Visual Art Tutors. The sessions will be drop in, with families staying for as long as they like, and there will be refreshments provided in their tearoom - providing further opportunities for families to relax, chat and get to know other families with shared experiences. Project Ability will have capacity for up to 30 people in the workshops at one time and have conservatively estimated that 60 people will take part in the day.
