Premises no longer trading as Aminas Beauty Salon, now a convenience store.

G Conditions
The licence holder **shall** ensure:

1. Details, including safety documentation and risk assessments of any special effects to be used at any event, including lasers, pyrotechnics, fireworks, smoke and vapour effects, strobe lighting, high power projectors, LEDs, and UV lights must be forwarded to NRS, Environmental Health at least 14 days prior to the use of the said effects.
2. Suitable security and stewarding measures must be implemented to ensure public safety.
3. Suitable measures must be implemented, to ensure that there is adequate provision of competent personnel, to ensure that crowd management and security duties are carried out.
4. If the premises do not have an existing food operation and you intend to provide food for an event and you must contact NRS, Environmental Health **at least 21 days prior to the event to discuss your proposals.**
5. Should your existing food operation be altered in any way to provide food for an event e.g. there is an increase in food production, there is a change in the type of food being provided, then you must contact NRS, Environmental Health **at least 21 days prior to the event to discuss your proposals.**
6. All waste materials generated must be uplifted and disposed of by a registered waste contractor, and records of the volume and type of waste made available for inspection by an authorised officer. Such records should be retained for a period of two years.
7. Applicants must refrain from advertising by fly-posting methods.
8. Noise from the venue shall not give rise to a Statutory Noise Nuisance in domestic dwellings (as defined in section 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990)
9. That they shall take all reasonably practicable steps to ensure that the installation and operation of any plant, machinery or equipment associated with the event shall not give rise to a noise level, assessed with windows open, within any dwelling or noise sensitive building in excess of that equivalent to Noise Rating Curve 25 between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 and Noise Rating Curve 35 at all other times.
10. That the Leq of the Music Noise Level (MNL) shall not exceed 65dB(A) over a 15minute period 1 metre from the façade of any noise sensitive premises for events held between the hours of 09:00 and 01:00 at Urban Venues.

H Observations on Proposals:

Aminas Beauty Salon has closed and the premises are now operated as a convenience store. Officers have been unable to visit to carry out appropriate inspection.
