# **Food Safety**

The licence holder shall ensure:

- 8. All food businesses trading at the proposed market are registered with the Environmental Health Department of their home Local Authority.
- 9. That they appoint a competent person to undertake matters relating to food safety and food standards and ensure Food Business operators at the market :
  - a) Comply with Regulation (EC) No. 852/2004, The Food Hygiene (Scotland) Regulations 2006, The Food Safety Act 1990, The Food Information Regulations 2014 and appropriate legislation.
  - b) Implement a fully documented Food Safety Management System (HACCP) in respect of any catering provision and that monitoring and verification records are kept in respect of any implemented system. These records shall be made available to Neighbourhoods and Sustainability, Environmental Health on request.
  - c) Ensure that all food handlers employed by them are supervised, instructed and/or trained in food hygiene matters appropriate to their work activity.
  - d) Adhere to The Food Standards Agency guidance on the Control of Cross-Contamination in respect of any catering provision.
  - e) Provide suitable and sufficient hand washing facilities.
  - f) Provide suitable and sufficient sinks for the purposes of cleaning and disinfecting work surfaces, equipment and utensils.
  - g) Provide a potable water supply for use in any catering provision.
  - h) Provide a suitable means of wastewater disposal.
- 10. That the following shall be submitted to NRS, Environmental Health in accordance with the timelines outlined below:

### **Noise**

The licence holder shall ensure:

- 11. That all works associated with the erection and dismantling of any structure, including fencing, associated with the event shall take place between 08:00 hours and 20:00 hours, Monday to Saturday and 10:00 hours and 20:00 hours on Sunday, unless permission has been authorised by NRS, Environmental Health to undertake this work out with these hours. Best Practicable Means shall be employed at all times to keep noise to a minimum.
- 12. That they shall take all reasonably practicable steps to ensure that the installation and operation of any plant, machinery or equipment associated with the event shall not give rise to a noise level, assessed with windows open, within any dwelling or noise sensitive building in excess of that equivalent to Noise Rating Curve 25 between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 and Noise Rating Curve 35 at all other times.
- 13. Noise from the venue shall not give rise to a Statutory Noise Nuisance in domestic dwellings (as defined in section 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990)

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The licence holder **shall** ensure:

- 14. That all waste materials generated from the market shall be uplifted and disposed of by a registered waste contractor.
- 15. That they shall refrain from advertising the market by fly-posting methods.
- 16. That the site shall be left in a clean and tidy condition.
