CIVIC GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1982 PRIVATE HIRE CAR I ICENCE - SUSPENDED

PRIVATE TIME GAR EIGENGE – 300F ENDED
Purpose of Report:
To advise Members of the circumstances leading to the immediate suspension of Mr Mohammad Sarwar's private hire car licence (PV27279).
Recommendations:
Members are asked to consider, in view of the background information and having given the licence holder an opportunity to be heard, whether to:-
(a) suspend Mr Sarwar's private hire car licence for the unexpired portion of its duration or such shorter period as you may determine and, if so, whether the suspension is with immediate effect; or
(b) revoke Mr Sarwar's private hire car licence.

1 Background

- 1.1 Mr Mohammad Sarwar was granted the renewal of his private hire car licence by this Authority on 17 September 2025 for a period of three years with effect from 1 July 2025 and with an expiry date of 30 June 2028.
- 1.2 The Licensing Section received complaints from the Chief Constable, Police Scotland dated 9 October 2025 requesting that Mr Sarwar's private hire car licence be suspended. A copy of the complaint will be tabled at the meeting.
- 1.3 In view of the terms of this information and in terms of paragraph 12 of Schedule 1 to the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, Mr Sarwar's private hire car licence was suspended on 10 October 2025 with immediate effect for a period of six weeks, since it was deemed that his continued operation of the private hire car would be likely to cause a serious threat to public safety.
- 1.4 Members will be aware that following the immediate suspension of Mr Sarwar's licence, this Committee is required to consider whether it is necessary or appropriate to suspend or revoke the licence in terms of paragraph 11 of Schedule 1 to the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.
