Noise

The licence holder shall ensure:

That they shall take all reasonably practicable steps to ensure that the installation and operation of any plant, machinery or equipment associated with the event shall not give rise to a noise level, assessed with windows open, within any dwelling or noise sensitive building in excess of that equivalent to Noise Rating Curve 25 between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 and Noise Rating Curve 35 at all other times.
- 12. That all works associated with the erection and dismantling of any structure, including fencing, associated with the event shall take place between 08:00 hours and 20:00 hours, Monday to Saturday and 10:00 hours and 20:00 hours on Sunday, unless permission has been authorised by NRS, Environmental Health to undertake this work out with these hours. Best Practicable Means shall be employed at all times to keep noise to a minimum.
- 13. Noise from the venue shall not give rise to a Statutory Noise Nuisance in domestic dwellings (as defined in section 79 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990)
