CIVIC GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT 1982 TAXI DRIVER'S LICENCE – SUSPENDED

Purpose of Report:
To advise Members of the circumstances leading to the immediate suspension of Mr Daniel Kelly's taxi driver's licence (TD16418).
Recommendations:
Members are asked to consider, in view of the background information and having given the licence holder an opportunity to be heard, whether to:-
(a) suspend Mr Kelly's taxi driver's licence for the unexpired portion of its duration or such shorter period as you may determine and, if so, whether the suspension is with immediate effect; or
(b) revoke Mr Kelly's taxi driver's licence.

1 Background

- 1.1 Mr Daniel Kelly was granted the renewal of his taxi driver's licence by this Authority on 23 May 2023 for a period of three years with effect from 1 September 2022 and with an expiry date of 31 August 2025 subject to the requirement that he attends medical examinations during the month of November 2023 and 2024.
- 1.2 The Licensing Section received a report from People Asset Management advising that Mr Kelly did not attend a recent medical examination.
- 1.3 In view of the terms of this information and in terms of paragraph 12 of Schedule 1 to the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, Mr Kelly's taxi driver's licence was suspended on 5 November 2024 with immediate effect for a period of six weeks, since it was deemed that his continued taxi driving would be likely to cause a serious threat to public safety.
- 1.4 Members will be aware that following the immediate suspension of Mr Kelly's licence, this Committee is required to consider whether it is necessary or appropriate to suspend or revoke the licence in terms of paragraph 11 of Schedule 1 to the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982.
