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AREA BUDGET 2025/26: APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING.

Purpose of Report:

To provide the Area Partnership with details of the current position of the 2025/26 Area Budget; inform members of applications considered under Delegated Functions; and make recommendations on further applications for funding.

Recommendations:

The Area Partnership is asked to:

- (1) note the budget position for 2025/26; and
- (2) consider the recommendations on applications received for Area Budget funding in 2025/26, as detailed in appendix 1.

Introduction.

 This report provides details on the Area Partnership's budget position for 2025/26; any applications considered under Delegated Functions; and makes recommendations on further funding applications.

Background.

- 2. Glasgow City Council agreed its budget for 2025/26 on 13th February 2025 with the overall funding available for Area Partnerships maintained at 2024/25 levels. The City Administration Committee approved allocations to Area Partnership on 13th March 2025. The Partick East Kelvindale Area Budget for 2025/26 is £60,284
- 3. The Area Partnership committed £21,971 from the 2025/26 Area Budget at its meeting on 23rd of April 2025 and £700 has been committed under the Scheme of Delegated Functions.
- 4. Therefore, a total of £22,671 has been committed to date to various projects serving the area, leaving a balance of £37,613 yet to be allocated.

Applications dealt with under Delegated Functions.

5. One application has been dealt with since the last meeting of the Area Partnership under Delegated Functions. Details of the applications are provided below:

Glasgow Clyde Colleges Building Better Futures Community Hub (Anniesland) PRN: 366/24	Funding is requested towards the cost of a 36 week programme for young people at Glasgow Clyde College Anniesland to introduce them into a college learning environment in an informal, non-threatening way. The project will engage with a minimum of 40 young people between the ages of 12-24 from areas of the North West of Glasgow with the highest deprivation, and run on a Thursday evening 5-7pm. To ensure adequate engagement, the college is working with a range of local partners including Glasgow Life, G15 and G20 Youth Projects. A range of activities will be provided, such as cooking classes, sports hall and use of IT equipment, as well as various external activities. Water, soft drinks and food will also be provided as many of the young people targeted live in low income households experiencing food and fuel poverty.
