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1. Background

- 1.1 The <u>Council Strategic Plan</u> was agreed at Full Council on 27 October 2022 and the Operational Performance Delivery and Scrutiny Committee is tasked with monitoring the delivery of the Strategic Plan.
- 1.2 Following agreement at the Operational and Delivery Scrutiny Committee (OPDSC) in November 2022, a template has been issued to all Services. The template structures and supports scrutiny of the Strategic Plan and illustrates the crosscutting nature of the Missions, as Services work together to deliver the Council's priorities. The template is subject to review to ensure Service and Member feedback is incorporated.
- 1.3 The latest version of Performance Manual to support the ongoing work of committee was presented to committee in August 2025.
- 1.4 A review of Strategic Plan commitments was concluded in <u>October 2024</u>. As previously noted the Strategic Plan Commitments will remain part of a process of ongoing review.

2. Council Strategic Plan

- 2.1 The Strategic Plan has been structured into 4 Grand Challenges and their supporting missions. The Grand Challenges are:
 - 1. Reduce poverty and inequality in our communities.
 - 2. Increase opportunity and prosperity for all our citizens.
 - 3. Fight the climate emergency in a just transition to a net zero Glasgow.
 - 4. Enable staff to deliver essential services in a sustainable, innovative and efficient way for our communities.
- 2.2 Each Grand Challenge is underpinned by Missions and Commitments. Services undertake the work to achieve the Commitments which in turn contributes to the goal of each Mission. This report focuses on:
 - Grand Challenge 3: Fight the climate emergency in a just transition to a net zero Glasgow
 - Mission 1: Deliver sustainable transport and travel aligned with the city region.
 - Mission 2: Become a net zero carbon city by 2030.
- 2.3 Council has agreed that the Strategic Plan will be subject to an annual review to reflect the volatility of outside pressures and budget constraints. There is a transparent change control process in place to assist this.

2.4 Council has previously received updates on Grand Challenge 3, Missions 1 and 2, on 12th March 2025.

3. Commitments and Emerging Commitments

- 3.1 Work is in progress to deliver the Strategic Plan commitments across key areas.
- 3.2 Some key areas relating to Grand Challenge 3 are included in this report. These are:
 - Delivery of the City Centre Transport Strategy and the Active Travel Strategy
 - Development of business cases for Clyde Metro
 - ➤ Investment in more council owned renewable energy generation
 - Working with partners to improve energy efficiency of all housing tenures by 2033
 - Delivery of sustainable urban drainage
 - Increasing the number of designated Local Nature Reserves
 - Working to reduce vacant and derelict land
 - Delivery of place based interventions and key local regeneration projects
 - 3.3 One action was noted as performing at Amber relating to the following commitment:
 - ➤ Develop a tree nursery so we can nurture the saplings, of local provenance, which we would then plant across the city and supply to the wider Glasgow Conurbation while also providing training and employment opportunities via a social enterprise.

4. Next Steps

4.1 The Strategic Plan remains under review so as to allow for consideration of emerging commitments. Where appropriate these commitments will be considered through the approval process for future inclusion in the Strategic Plan.
