**The Provision of Works for Carriageway Resurfacing (Package 2)  
Tender Reference: - GCC006563CPU**

**Purpose of Report:**

To submit details of the tenders received for the provision of works for carriageway resurfacing (Package 2) and recommend acceptance of the most economically advantageous tender as detailed in this report.

## 1 Background and Tender

- 1.1 Glasgow City Council's ("the council's") budget for the provision of works for carriageway resurfacing works (Package 2) is £7,500,000 .
- 1.2 The purpose of the carriageway resurfacing works is to improve the condition of the city's road network by resurfacing defined sections of carriageway as identified within the specified site information for each work package. Work package 2 covers the following areas:
- Ward 1 - Linn
  - Ward 2 – Newlands / Auldburn
  - Ward 3 – Greater Pollok
  - Ward 4 – Cardonald
  - Ward 5 – Govan
- 1.3 A commodity team consisting of stakeholders from Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability (NRS) and the Corporate Procurement Unit (CPU) was formed to develop the sourcing strategy and deliver a new contract.
- 1.4 It was agreed that mini competition process via lot 1 of the councils Civils & Infrastructure framework would be the most appropriate method to deliver this contract.
- 1.5 The duration of the contract is 10 months.
- 1.6 The contract will be utilised by NRS.

## 2 Evaluation

- 2.1 The mini-competition comprised of 4 individual work packages. The council chose to award different framework contractors to each work package to ensure capability and capacity and contract delivery by 10 months. A defined evaluation process was set out in the tender documents which detailed package 1 would be evaluated first and the remaining packages evaluated thereafter in sequence. The top ranked contractor for package 1 would not be considered for package 2 and this process was followed for packages 3&4.
- 2.2 10 contractors on Lot 1 were invited to bid and 7 submitted a bid. Of the 3 contractors that failed to respond, 3 failed to cite a reason for not responding.
- 2.3 The award evaluation was based on the following criteria and weightings: -

\*The Fair Work First scores were carried forward from the framework stage.

2.4 The evaluation of award scoring and award value of the contractor which has been recommended for award within is shown in the table below:-

### 3 Contract implementation and Supplier Management

3.1 This is an NEC4 contract therefore responsibility for monitoring day-to-day delivery of the contract will remain with the relevant NRS officer appointed to the role of Project Manager.

3.2 The agreed community benefits outcomes commitments will be monitored via Cenefits which is a web based monitoring tool. We will also capture sustainable commitments within the CPU Sustainable Register.

3.3 The Purchase to Pay route is SAP Non Purchase Order.

### 4 Policy and Resource Implications

#### Resource Implications:

*Financial:* The award value of the works contract is £5,071,193.

NRS has confirmed its acceptance of a one-off cost avoidance saving amounting to £2,428,807. This figure is based on the variance between the award value and the £7,500,000 budget for the project.

- 2 x New Employee - Full Time Job (from Priority Group)
- 4x Work Experience Placement – School
- 5 x Workplace Visit
