

Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005

Annual Functions Report – 2025-2026 (year ending 31 March 2026)

Purpose of Report:

To advise members of the Local Licensing Forum on the annual functions of the Licensing Board under section 9A of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 over financial year 2025/26.

- 1. Statement of how the Licensing Board has had regard to the Licensing Objectives (Section 9A (2)(a)(i) of the 2005 Act)**
 - 1.1 Five licensing objectives have been established that are designed to represent the principles upon which the 2005 Act is based. The licensing objectives are:
 - (a) Preventing crime and disorder;
 - (b) Securing public safety;
 - (c) Preventing public nuisance;
 - (d) Protecting and improving public health; and
 - (e) Protecting children and young persons from harm
 - 1.2 The application of the licensing objectives is of paramount importance to the Board in carrying out its functions and determining applications lodged under the 2005 Act.
- 2. Statement of how the Licensing Board has had regard to its Licensing Policy Statement (Section 9A(2)(a)(ii) of the 2005 Act)**
 - 2.1 The Policy Statement states how the Board will exercise its licensing functions in order to promote the five licensing objectives when considering applications.
 - 2.2 Whilst every application is considered on its own merit, the Board's Policy Statement was designed to provide licence holders, prospective licence holders, members of the public and responsible authorities with information in advance, on the Board's general approach to the making of licensing decisions.
 - 2.3 The Board has regard to its Licensing Policy Statement, adopted on 5 November 2023 when considering all applications.

5. General

- 5.1 Schedule 1 of the 2005 Act provides that a Board shall consist of such number of members (being not fewer than five and not more than ten) as may be determined by the relevant Council. Members of a Board must be appointed by the Council from amongst their Councillors. The Board is currently made up of 9 Elected Members from the Council.
- 5.2 The Board normally meets every four weeks throughout the year, apart from when the Council is in recess. The meetings take place in the Burgh Court Hall, City Chambers.
- 5.3 In the 2025/26 financial year the Board met on 11 occasions to consider various licensing applications under the 2005 Act. A shorthand writer is present at each Board meeting and the transcript from each meeting is available on request to the Clerk to the Board after the meeting. The decisions made by the Board for each application are published on the Council's website.
- 5.4 Information and assistance are provided by the Council's licensing department and the licensing standards officer to members of the public wishing to apply for a licence or to complain about the operation of licensed premises.
- 5.5 In addition to the information and assistance provided by the Council's licensing staff, many guidance documents and application forms are available from the Council's website.
