

Behaviour Change Project – Acceptance of external funding approved – Declaration of interest.

6 Councillor Millar, City Convener for Climate, Glasgow Green Deal, Transport and City Centre Recovery, presented a report regarding the funding position for the Sustainable Transport Infrastructure and Behaviour Change Project and the acceptance of external funding, advising

- (1) that the Council had historically accepted external funding which was then distributed to third sector organisations, and was now in a position to accept external funding through Strathclyde Passenger for Transport's (SPT) People and Place Fund which was used specifically to facilitate behaviour change projects undertaken by third sector organisations which were critical elements of the Council's Transport Strategy;
- (2) that the Council had sought expressions of interest for funding from members of the Glasgow Community Cycling Network, and that following an assessment of the applications received, SPT confirmed that £599,404.20 of funding had been secured for behaviour change initiatives across a broad programme of activity, which was £362,746.80 less than for 2025/26 but that this would increase subject to committee approval;
- (3) of a summary of projects and organisations which were funded via People and Place Fund, as detailed in the report; and
- (4) that an update on the activities of these organisations would be presented to the Environment and Liveable Neighbourhoods City Policy Committee as part of the annual Sustainable Transport update.

After consideration, the committee approved the acceptance of the SPT People and Place external grant fund.

In terms of Standing Order No 27, Councillor Kelly declared an interest in this item of business and left the meeting and took no part in the discussion or decision thereon.
