

Police Scotland ward update noted.

4 There was heard a report by Inspector Emma Mark, Police Scotland, advising the partnership that;

- (1) violence figures had decreased across the ward and this was a positive reflection of the drive in work for community engagement that had been carried out;
- (2) Police Scotland would be reintroducing 'Coffee with a Cop' at the local libraries which would be up and running by the end of February 2026;
- (3) 3 part-time school police campus officers had been assigned to schools across the north west area to continue to work with the youths;
- (4) there had been a reduction in house break ins across the ward which was very positive;
- (6) Police Scotland had linked in with Glasgow City Council, Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability and RSPCA regarding the ongoing issue of dog fouling within the ward; and
- (7) fly tipping was an on-going issue across the ward and was a city-wide problem that needed addressed with Police Scotland keen to get involved in littering campaigns such as 'Clean for Green' to support this.

After consideration, the Partnership,

- (a) noted the report; and
- (b) thanked Inspector Mark for all the hard work carried out within the ward by Police Scotland.
