

CARDONALD AREA PARTNERSHIP'S MINUTES.

Minutes of meeting held on 10th February 2026, in Nethercraigs Sport Complex.

Cardonald Area Partnership.

Minutes of previous meetings approved – Request to Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability.

1 The minutes of 18th November 2025 were submitted and approved, subject to noting

(1) that Bailie Kavanagh had advised the Partnership that the Festive Lights at the Halfway location had not been working throughout the festive period; and

(2) a request to the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability that an officer from the NRS Festive Lighting team should be invited to attend the next meeting of this Partnership in April to discuss the issue and the possible option of reimbursement.

Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework - Membership update noted.

2 There was submitted a report by the Director of Legal and Administration providing an update regarding the membership of this Partnership, advising that since the previous meeting, no changes had been made to the membership.

Community Planning Partnership – Governance Framework - Register of Interests noted.

3 There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Legal and Administration advising the Partnership of the requirements in relation to the Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework regarding the registration

and declaration of members' interests and detailing those interests which had been declared by members of the Partnership, as detailed in the report.

Scottish Fire and Rescue Service ward update noted.

4 There was heard and noted a report by Watch Commander Richard Talbot Scottish Fire and Rescue Service (SFRS) regarding the current issues, incidents and work being carried out in the ward for Quarter 3, from 1st October to 31st December 2025, advising the Partnership

- (1) that the service had attended 652 incidents in the South area that included 145 fires, 161 non-fire incidents and 228 false alarms, 71 Unwanted Fire Alarm Signals (UFAS) with 3 non-fire fatalities recorded;
- (2) of the 8 road traffic collisions in the South Area, there were 1 non-fatal casualties and 2 people rescued by firefighters;
- (3) of the accidental dwelling fire casualties 5 were non-fatal and 2 people had been rescued by firefighters;
- (4) that there had been 297 Home Fire Safety Visits and 50 Fire safety audits completed in the South Area;
- (5) that they had liaised with Police to reduce antisocial behaviour in the ward, by clearing areas of undergrowth and moving clothes bins to stop deliberate fire raising; and
- (6) that they were working with local schools to educate children on the dangers of fire raising.

Police Scotland ward update noted.

5 There was heard and noted a report by Inspector Jamie Lyall, Police Scotland, advising the Partnership

- (1) that for the 2026 festive period, Police Scotland had launched initiatives focusing on reducing impaired driving and regulating licensed premises;
- (2) of the work being done by officers regarding E-bikes, informing parents of the dangers and legislation around their use;
- (3) of the drop-in session in Penilee Community Centre on the 27th February where you could have 'a coffee with a cop'; and
- (4) of the new campus police that had been positioned in Rosshall Academy and Lourdes Secondary School.

After discussion, the Partnership thanked Inspector Lyall for his report.

Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership – Ward update noted.

6 There was submitted and noted a report by the Chief Officer, Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership (GCHSCP) providing an update on activity within the Ward, advising

- (1) that the Glasgow City Health Improvement Training Calendar offered different levels of training on a range of subjects from at various levels and that further information and booking details could be accessed via <https://www.nhsggc.scot/your-health/public-health/health-improvement/glasgow-city-hscp-health-improvement/training-calendar/>
- (2) of the Quit Your Way smoking service support and the face to face clinics as well as the telephone support, to help people to stop smoking;

- (4) of the Health, Exercise and Nutrition for the Really Young (HENRY) Staring Solids workshops and Fussy Eating workshops in the Glasgow South area; and
- (5) of the Glasgow City Wellbeing Winter Welfare guide [Glasgow City Wellbeing Guide](#)

Neighbourhood Infrastructure Improvement Fund (NIIF) update noted etc – Funding approved – Request to Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability.

7 With reference to the minutes of 30th April 2025, there was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability (NRS) providing an update on the Neighbourhood Infrastructure Improvement Fund (NIIF) programme, advising a progress update in relation to the NIIF, including proposals submitted for estimate and a summary of committed spend and actual spend for the ward, as detailed in tables 1 and 3.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the proposals and spend to date, as detailed in the report; and
- (2) approved the estimates for work to be programmed on the following projects:-
 - (a) 04-009 – £9,500 – Redeployable CCTV at Cardonald Place Road;
 - (b) 04-011 – £9,500 - Redeployable CCTV at Crookston Road

- (c) 04-016 – £39,000 – Pathway and stairs to be repaired at Hartlaw Crescent;
 - (d) 04-024 – £19,000 – two Redeployable CCTV at Cemetery Road;
 - (e) 04-028 – £9,500 - Redeployable CCTV at Kinnell Avenue;
 - (f) 04-029 – £9,500 - Redeployable CCTV at Moulin Crescent
 - (g) 04-031 – £11,025.67 – Litter hubs for schools in the Ward;
 - (h) 04-036 - £15,000 – repair drainage at Rosshall Park; and
 - (i) 04-037 - £150,000 – breakdown required for the upgrade of the Tannadice MUGA; and
- (3) requested that the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability provide further information to the next meeting on the following projects:
- (a) 04-035 – site visit and meeting required to discuss the creation of parking spaces at Nethercraigs Sports Complex; and
 - (b) 04-034 – CCTV to be relocated to Ladymuir Crescent.

Neighbourhood Infrastructure Improvement Fund – Community engagement update noted – Request to Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability and Head of Policy and Corporate Governance

8 With reference to the minutes of 16th September 2025 providing an update on Neighbourhood Infrastructure Improvement Fund (NIIF) Community Engagement, there was submitted a report by the Head of Policy and Corporate Governance providing additional NIIF ideas that had been submitted and NIIF allocation options to consider, as detailed in the appendices to the report.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) agreed to forward proposals for costings to Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability for
 - (i) the resurfacing of Aros Lane at Corkerhill Train Station;
 - (ii) 2 cameras at Bowfield Place/Path; and
- (b) requested that the Head of Policy and Corporate Governance liaise with Police Scotland to

- (i) look at proposals to install 6 cctv cameras at Our Lady of the Rosary Nursery and Primary School; and
- (ii) arrange a site visit and for a crime prevention survey to be carried out that could assist with the location of the cameras.

Area Budget 2025/26 – Applications for funding dealt with etc.

9 With reference to the minutes of the Council's City Administration Committee of 13th March 2025, when the committee approved the 2025/26 Area Budget allocations, there was submitted a report by the Head of Policy and Corporate Governance, advising

- (1) of the current position in relation to the Area Partnership's budget for 2025/26;
- (2) that the Cardonald Area Partnership's Budget allocation for 2025/26 was £67,115 and that £67,115 had been allocated to date, leaving a balance of £0;
- (3) that 2 applications had been dealt with under delegated authority since the last meeting; and
- (4) that no Area Budget Applications had been received since the last Area Partnership meeting.

After consideration, the Partnership noted the budget position for 2025/26
