

Neighbourhood Infrastructure Improvement Fund - Community Engagement update noted – Request to Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability.

7 There was submitted and noted a report by the Head of Policy and Corporate Governance, providing a list of ideas for funding from the Neighbourhood Infrastructure Improvement Fund that had been submitted by community organisations within the ward.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) agreed to submit the following ideas for costings,
 - (a) purchase and installation of a permanent concrete table tennis table in Naseby Play Park, adjacent to the existing children's play area;
 - (b) purchase and installation of benches at the Marlborough Gardens Oval;
 - (c) lighting issues within Naseby Park;
 - (d) improve paths and lighting within Broomhill Community Park;
 - (e) road and pavement resurfacing on Smith Street;
 - (f) road and pavement resurfacing on Primrose Street;
 - (g) installation of 2 BBQ benches in Victoria Park;
 - (h) the traffic calming hump at the Clyde Tunnel on the north side of Dumbarton Road;
 - (i) improvement to Whiteinch Cross to compliment ongoing community-led initiatives, including the installation of a lights stage growing wall, planters and benches;
 - (j) costings for traffic calming measures around St Thomas Aquinas to reduce traffic congestion;
 - (k) speed management measures on Southbrae Drive - Jordanhill Community Council supported the investigation of the installation of a vehicle activated speed display sign to encourage lower vehicle speeds and improve pedestrian safety;
 - (l) nature trail lighting – costings to provide low-level, wildlife-sensitive lighting along the darker sections of the trail, improving safety and accessibility during the winter months;
 - (m) potential improvements to the green space at Broomhill Drive; and

- (n) improvements to Broomhill Lane leading to Thornwood Drive; and
- (2) requested that the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability arrange a meeting with Wheatley Homes Glasgow to discuss potential options in relation to improving the pathways and lighting within Broomhill Community Park.
