

**CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.**

Minutes of the meeting held on 30th January 2019 at the Reidvale Neighbourhood Centre, Glasgow.

**Minutes of previous meeting approved.**

1 The minutes of 21st November 2018 were submitted and approved.

**Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework – Membership update noted etc.**

2 There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing an update regarding membership of this Partnership, advising that

- (1) Linda Pike had left as the representative for Bridgeton/Dalmarnock Community Council and had been replaced with Nancy Humphries; and
- (2) Margaret Storrie was now the representative for West of Scotland Housing Association.

**Strategic Development Framework – Presentation noted etc.**

3 The Partnership heard a presentation by Ms H Claridge and Ms L Pratt, Development and Regeneration Services regarding Glasgow's Strategic Development Framework, advising that the framework

- (1) provided a spatial overview of what was happening in each area of the city and would adapt and interpret City Development Plan outcomes, policies and principles at the sub-city scale;
- (2) aimed to develop a long term vision and strategy for the future development of the area and sought to understand and reflect local priorities and opportunities for delivering change;
- (3) acted as a means of co-ordinating existing and future regeneration activity and provided a context that would support investment and attract funding;
- (4) set out a delivery process and an action programme; and
- (5) identified areas where more detailed planning work, such as a masterplan, was required.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the presentation;
- (b) raised various questions and concerns which were duly addressed by Ms Claridge and Ms Pratt.

#### **Reducing Social Isolation discussion – Priorities noted.**

**4** With reference to the minutes of 21st November 2018 requesting that a discussion take place in relation to the Reducing Social Isolation priority, the Partnership, after discussion agreed

- (1) that the age and gender demographic for this priority should be 25+, both male and female;
- (2) that Partners provided details of any services which addressed this priority in their area for the next meeting; and
- (3) to ring-fence £20,000 from the Area Partnership Budget for this priority.

#### **Police Scotland update noted etc.**

**5** There was heard a verbal update by Inspector John Gormlie, Police Scotland, advising the Partnership of the current progress that Police Scotland was making in the Ward in relation to serious assault, housebreaking, anti-social behaviour, drug use/dealing and vandalism in the last quarter.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the update; and

- (2) expressed their gratitude to Police Scotland for the continuing work it carried out in the Ward.

### **Scottish Fire and Rescue Service - Ward update noted etc.**

**6** There was heard a report by Mr Craig Carenduff, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service, advising the Partnership of the current issues, incidents and work being carried out within the Ward within the last 3 months, including a draft report, advising,

- (1) that 93 home safety visits had been carried out;
- (2) of the ongoing community safety activities within the Ward including the installation of fire alarms; and
- (3) that there were 56 Unwanted Fire Alarms.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report;
- (b) agreed the new format of the report; and
- (c) thanked the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service for their ongoing valuable work in the Ward.

### **Area Budget 2018/19 – Current position noted**

**7** There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities regarding the Area Budget for 2018/19, advising that

- (1) to date £85,042 (100%) of the 2018/19 budget had been allocated to various projects in the Ward; and
- (2) of an application received that had been deemed ineligible and of applications received that could not be dealt with under delegated authority due to insufficient funds being available.

### **Area Budget 2019/20 noted etc.**

**8** There was submitted a report by the Council's Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities, regarding the current position in relation to the 2019/20 Area Budget, advising

- (1) that the Area Budget allocations for 2019/20 were subject to Glasgow City Council approving its budget for 2019/20 and that any revisions to current levels of budget would be subject to a future report;

- (2) of the interim arrangements which enabled the allocation of a portion of the funding from 2019/20 IGF Area Budget in January/February cycle of the 23 Area Partnerships for time critical applications;
  - (3) that time critical awards of up to £500 could be allocated from the 2019/20 budget under the existing delegated authority arrangements;
  - (4) that any IGF area budget awards made from 2019/20 budget were made subject to IGF available finances; and
  - (5) of applications for funding from the 2019/20 budget, including playscheme and travel pass awards.
- (a) noted the position regarding the 2019/20 budget;
  - (b) dealt with the application for funding as follows, the grant awards being time critical and subject to the conditions detailed in the report:-

- (c) in terms of the Travel Pass Scheme, approved the issue of travel passes for use during the school holidays of spring, summer and October 2019 periods to Carbon Footprints, Connect 2 OSCS Dalmarnock, Dennistoun After School Care and Rising Stars; and
- (d) approved the award of playscheme funding to Glasgow Women's Aid, East End of £390 for Spring, £1,248 Summer and £195 October 2019 and to \*PEEK of £420 for Spring, £1,260 Summer and £210 October 2019, subject to satisfactory assessment and receipt of any outstanding information.
