B SUMMARY OF PROJECT STATUS IN THE PROGRAMME

Member Authorities (MAs) submit detailed quarterly project status reports to the Programme Management Office (PMO). These are reported in the detailed Quarterly Programme Status Reports that are submitted to the Chief Executives' Group and Cabinet. In this interim report, details are provided of any subsequent issues of escalation which are submitted to the PMO by MAs and an update on Programme activities.

B.1 INFRASTRUCTURE FUND PROGRAMME

No issues for escalation have been submitted to the PMO.

B.2 SKILLS PROGRAMME:

At their meeting on 6 March, the City Region Skills and Employment Portfolio Group agreed broad criteria for a successor programme to Working Matters. The new programme will utilise underspends from the DWP Grant for Working Matters and will be fully matched by member authorities.

Proposed as 'genuine city region offer', the programme will be consistent in terms of client group, activity undertaken and outcomes delivered. The programme will be delivered across Member Authorities who agree to provide match funding and the majority of Member Authorities have indicated they wish to be involved. The successor programme will be managed through the City Region Skills and Employment Portfolio. Programme Lead therefore will be South Lanarkshire Council supported by the Senior Portfolio Development Officer (People).

B.3 INNOVATION PROGRAMME:

No issues for escalation have been submitted to the PMO.

B.4 PROGRAMME RISKS

The Programme Risk Register was updated and all updates are noted in bold and italics in Appendix 1. Risk 039 re Brexit has been added to the list.

D.1.2 Programme Mapping

The Programme Mapping is continuing to progress with assistance from Clydeplan. An update of the mapping for each Member Authority business case will be provided within the April PMO report.

D.2 SKILLS AND EMPLOYMENT PROJECTS

Working Matters

The Working Matters project concluded on 31 March 2019. As the programme comes to a conclusion the most recent figures reported by the monthly CMCF have shown a slowdown in job outcomes. The lead authority is in discussions with the DWP to identify job outcomes that may not have been captured on the Hanlon MI system for clients who have received a service from the Working Matters Programme and moved into employment but disengaged without reporting employment outcomes achieved.

Table 1 below provides details of progress towards the Job Outcome target broken down by each member authority area for the latest CMCF report covering the period to 23 February 2019.

*WDC has focussed Working Matters activity on providing intensive support for people with health issues and most distant from the labour market at the early stage of the employability pathway. As clients progress on the pathway they move onto WDC's European funded 'employability pipeline'. WDC have not included clients who have started on Working Matters but moved onto the 'employability pipeline' and secured positive outcomes at later stages as a result. These outcomes will be reported in WDC's separate Employability Pipeline reporting.

As set out at Section B.2 of this report, the Skills & Employment Portfolio Group are developing a proposal to utilise the Working Matters underspend that is anticipated to be approximately £740,000 made up of both grant and match. At the CEG on 28th March, the majority of Member Authorities agreed to participate in the scheme. Discussions are ongoing with the DWP to finalise the programme and a report will be brought back to Cabinet once these have been concluded.

In Work Progression

The In Work Progression Pilot project concluded on 31 December 2018. The final performance figures were reported to Cabinet on 12 February 2019 and it is anticipated that the full evaluation report for the In Work Progression Pilot will be presented to Cabinet in June 2019.

D.3 PROGRAMME GOVERNANCE

D.3.1 Assurance Framework Review

An updated Assurance Framework (AF) was submitted to the Chief Executives' Group on 28 March and has subsequently been issued to partners, including the Scottish and UK governments, for consideration. All comments have been collated and shared with all MAs. The PMO held a workshop on 12 March 2019 with LOG to review all comments and PMO responses. Subject to government approval processes, it is anticipated that the refreshed Assurance Framework will be presented to the Cabinet in June 2019 for approval.

D.3.2 Programme Business Case

A refreshed draft Programme Business Case (PBC) and Regional Strategic Assessment, setting key regional economic information, were submitted to the Chief Executives' Group in January and has subsequently been issued for consultation to partners, including the Scottish and UK Governments. It is was intended to present an updated version to CEG in March and Cabinet in April however this has not been possible due to limited resources within the PMO. It is anticipated that the refreshed PBC will continue to develop taking into account comments received and include all augmented OBC's at that time. The PMO anticipate this will be presented to June 2019 Cabinet.

D.3.3 Modelling Framework

An Intelligence Hub Officer has now been appointed and will co-locate with economists at the Fraser of Allander Institute at the University of Strathclyde to develop a Computable General Equilibrium (CGE) model for the City Region. SPT has agreed to provide the FAI with access to its Strathclyde Integrated Transport and Land Use Model (SITLUM) in order to ensure that, as far as possible, the CGE model can be linked into this other key Regional model. Once complete, the model will be used to generate an up-to-date estimate on the economic impact of the City Deal Infrastructure Programme. A member of the FAI project team provided an update to the Commission for Economic Growth on Monday 18 March 2019.

D.3.4 Annual Conversation

The Annual Conversation meeting with the Joint Government Scottish City Region Deals Delivery Board took place on the 18 February 2019. Minutes of this meeting were presented to the CEG 28 March.

D.3.5 Scottish Parliamentary Inquiry

A further evidence session for the Scottish Parliamentary Inquiry on City Deals was held on 27th February, with the GCR Cabinet Chair, representatives from the Chief Executives' Group, the PMO and also SQW economic consultancy in attendance. A video record of the meeting is available to view online and the Official Report is available on the Scottish Parliament website. Subjects covered during the session included questions in relation to whether there had been delays to key milestones or deadlines revised or missed. An update was provided on the approach to augmented Business Cases, the newly created Regional Economic Partnership and the An overview on our employability and innovation projects Innovation Districts. included particular focus on the Working Matters project. The Committee requested that details be provided on our employability projects. The latest status of the **Airport** Access project was discussed and a detailed overview provided. Private Sector investment on the back of the City Deal was raised. The Committee asked about displacement and specific questions were posed to SQW regarding progress with the evaluation and data collected so far on what the Deal has delivered to date. The review process for projects and frameworks in place for adding or removing projects were raised.

A further evidence session with representatives of other more recently progressed or progressing took place on 13th March. Key areas of question and discussion were progress updates on each Deal, frameworks for decision making, funding and individual allocations of funding from each of the UK and Scottish Governments. Further evidence sessions are planned, including with the Scottish Cabinet Secretary for Transport, Infrastructure and Connectivity and the Secretary of State for Scotland.

D.3.6 Commission on Economic Growth

On the 18 March 2019 the Commission on Economic Growth considered the Fraser of Allander proposal for economic modelling; considered the Regional Strategic Assessment; presented a paper on Inclusive Growth, updated the Commission on the Future Work; discussed the gateway and evaluation requirements at Gateway.

D.3.7 Gateway Review 1

The draft One Year Out Report was approved by the Cabinet on 12 February 2019. SQW, the consultants leading on the National Evaluation Panel process, have started to engage with all MAs as part of the next stage of the implementation of the Local Evaluation Plan.

D.4.1 COMMUNICATION, MARKETING AND STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

A second Director's Blog was posted on the subject of the City Region's three emerging Innovation Districts. This was promoted via Twitter and has been supported through other stakeholder channels. A Glasgow City Region Newsletter was issued to Programme stakeholders and to the eight Heads of Communication for soft copy issue to all Member Authority Elected Members.

Discussions are underway with colleagues at The Scotland Office in relation to supportive communication activities about the GCR City Deal, with a short film planned and further updates to the UK Government website.

A further conference on Scotland's City Deals will take place in May 2019, organised by the same company which delivered the similar session in August of last year. Speakers confirmed so far include Dr Morag Watt (Cities Team, The Scottish Government), Neil MacLennan (Scotland Office) and Councillor Susan Aitken.

In terms of media, the Glasgow Chamber of Commerce magazine ran a detailed update feature on the City Deal. The Evening Times and the Sun ran pieces on Working Matters on the back of the evidence session at the Scottish Parliamentary Inquiry. Recent developments in relation to the Airport Access project generated

further coverage. Inverclyde Council's approval of the Inchgreen Business Case was picked up by local media. Discussions are underway for detailed features on the City Deal in both The Planner and Building and Construction Design.

The PMO and Communications Group are reviewing options for refreshing and developing the City Region website. East Renfrewshire Council has provided substantial resource to date in supporting the development, ongoing maintenance and hosting of the City Deal website. ERC is in the process of procuring a new website content management system and therefore it may not be able to continue hosting the existing website, beyond the next 9-12 months. Other options are under consideration and will be reported at a future meeting.

D.5 BENEFIT REALISATION & QUARTERLY PROJECT MONITORING

D.5.1 Project Outputs Monitoring

The latest output and outcome monitoring of the projects that are subject to the first Gateway Review process, and the City Deal community benefits outputs were reported to the CEG on 31/1/19 and the Cabinet on 12/2/19. These will be updated and included within the next quarterly report.

D.5.2 Proposed Contract and Community Benefit Solution

The Cabinet on the 12th February 2019 approved a proposal to progress with the pilot of the community benefits reporting solution across the 8 MAs. The PMO is working with the MAs and the developers to progress the implementation of the pilot and is engaging with Glasgow as the lead authority to resolve IT and data protection issues and to conclude the contract for the Cenefits system.
