Walkabout:

The walkabout arranged for 9th November was cancelled as the previous meeting over-ran. The rescheduled walkabout with councillors and Officials will take place after the Greater Pollok Area Partnership meeting in February. The areas to be observed will be Hurlet, Roughmussel, Mulben and Raeswood.

AOCB

Universal Credit support worker from Jobs & Business Glasgow joined us to talk about her role. She is based in the Pollok Civic Realm and reaches out to unemployed – They offer help with CVs, skills, better futures. Materials for online & offline promotion of services.

Issues in the Roughmussel area were raised and discussed. It was noted that it's a very steep area and the grit bin has recently been taken away from Kinarvie Road. The residents are worried about safety when it's icy, particularly as there is an elderly population in the area. It was noted that there may be volunteers from local charities that can help with gritting, including the Amina Project.

Bin lorries won't come up Kinarvie Road as "too narrow" - raised with Cllr Spear.

New estates need gritting too, but there are limited resources due to council cutbacks.

Mirror needed at corner of Kinarvie Road and Faskin (at top of steps) so road users can see round corner. Feb walkabout to cover this area.

Minutes tips from CC Forum via HMacD - redact names, privacy notice available from council website. AD to resend website details to DH.

Both exits at Parklands are now busier due to connecting road from new builds being opened up. Traffic lights should be resequenced to accommodate the new volumes.

New ramp at Brockburn Road for pedestrians up to bus stops is now completed. Another success for the Community Council.

Brockburn Road surface is breaking up in middle of carriageway - repair was promised last year but was downgraded before work allocated.

Can zigzags at Crookston Castle Primary be better signposted? Flashing lights don't work. Green man only on post, not up high. Same parents flouting highway code every day just because they can't be bothered to walk. Is Community Policing an option. Police fines for offenders? There are cars going wrong way on Glenside drive. Would Community Safety provide a banner?

AD mentioned again the drainage and drain issue at the corner of Leithland Road & Kempsthorn Road & Kempsthorn Crescent. Field drain needed and drain unblocking.
