

City Centre Strategy - Draft Blythwood District Regeneration Framework (Ward 10) – Public consultation approved.

2 Councillor Aitken, Leader of the Council and City Convener for Inclusive Economic Growth, presented a report regarding the progress in developing the Blythwood District Regeneration Framework (BDRF) (Ward 10), advising

- (1) that the City Centre Strategy 2014-19 comprised of 55 ambitious actions including the development of a district strategy for each of the 9 city centre districts, with the district strategy comprising of 2 elements, as detailed in the report;
- (2) that the BDRF was commissioned in 2017 as part of a group of 4 District Regeneration Frameworks, incorporating the Broomielaw, Central and St Enoch districts in addition to Blythwood, with the BDRF having been prepared in collaboration with a wide range of stakeholders and consultees, as detailed in the report;
- (3) that the recommendations and proposals had undergone a detailed review, with a focus on deliverability, and a rationalised draft action plan had been produced for consideration as part of the proposed public consultation;
- (4) of the overall findings of the development of the BDRF and the 7 strategic themes, which had been developed for the BDRF and associated draft action plan;
- (5) of the delivery and governance arrangements; and
- (6) that it was proposed to commence an 8-week public consultation on the draft BDRF from 31st January 2020.

After consideration, the committee

- (a) approved the proposals to commence public consultation on the draft BDRF;
- (b) agreed that
 - (i) the public consultation would commence on 31st January 2020 for a period of 8 weeks; and
 - (ii) on completion of the public consultation, the BDRF final report would be submitted to this committee for approval; and
- (c) noted that the District Regeneration Frameworks would become Supplementary Planning Guidance to the City Development Plan after the City Centre Strategic Development Framework had been approved.
