

**CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.**

Minutes of the meeting held on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2018 at the City Chambers, Glasgow.

**Minutes of previous meeting approved.**

**1** The minutes of 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2017 were submitted and approved.

**Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework – Membership update noted.**

**2** There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing an update regarding membership of this Partnership.

After consideration, the Partnership noted

- (1) the report;
- (1) Craig Carenduff was now the representative for Scottish Fire and Rescue Services with Paul Tyrrell as the substitute representative;
- (2) James MacKenzie was now the representative for Parkhead Community Council; and
- (3) Sergeant Elaine Eaton was now the substitute representative for Police Scotland.

### **Bin Replacement Programme - Update noted etc.**

**3** There was heard a presentation by the Acting Executive Director of Land and Environmental Services, regarding the City Wide Bin Replacement Programme, advising

- (1) that the bin replacement programme was a 3 year city wide programme to remove dustbins from flats and provide larger general waste and recycling wheelie bins;
- (2) of information on how to recycle and of how the programme benefitted the community;
- (3) of the key stakeholders;
- (4) that currently in the Calton Ward there were 2,560 dustbins and 1,011 common bin areas;
- (5) that the first phase of the programme was currently underway in Drumchapel and was due to conclude in March 2018 with the Calton Ward included in Phase 2 of the programme which would commence in April 2018 until March 2019 and that stage 3 would cover the South of the City from April 2019 to March 2020; and
- (6) of the current improvement work that had taken place.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the presentation; and
- (b) raised a number of questions which were answered by Ms V Friary, Land and Environmental Services.

### **Out to Play – Presentation noted.**

**4** There was heard a presentation by Nina Doherty, Eco Drama, advising the Partnership of the outcomes of the project in Dalmarnock Primary School, advising

- (1) that the Out to Play, Eco Drama, which received funding from this Partnership ran from August to October 2017 in Dalmarnock Primary School;
- (2) that 91 sessions were delivered across 7 weeks with 373 participating pupils from ages 5-11 years;
- (3) Out to Play had engaged with children and teachers with arts-based outdoor learning experiences tailored to their own playground, making use of the outdoor spaces to promote imagination, creative play and adventure in learning;

- (4) that pupils and teachers were asked to fill out an evaluation survey before and after the residency to assess any change in opinion; and
- (5) of the various positive outcomes of the evaluation and both teacher and pupil feedback.

After consideration, the Partnership noted and thanked Ms Doherty for her presentation.

#### **Multi Member Ward Plan - Update noted.**

**5** There was heard a report by Inspector John Gormlie, Police Scotland, advising the Partnership of the current progress that Police Scotland was making within the Ward and of the current statistics in relation to crime and anti-social behaviour, housebreaking, drug use/dealing and flytipping.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the report; and
- (2) thanked Inspector Gormlie for the positive work that was being carried in the Ward with noticeable improvements.

#### **Parkhead/Dalmarnock/Camlachie Thriving Places – Update noted.**

**6** There was heard and noted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing an update on the progress in relation to the Parkhead/Dalmarnock/Camlachie Thriving Place, advising of

- (1) locality plans;
- (2) the thriving places approach;
- (3) the North East Senior Officers Group recommended actions for the approach in Parkhead/Dalmarnock/Camlachie;
- (4) the Steering Group's working arrangements with regards to the
  - (a) terms of reference;
  - (b) structure;
  - (c) membership;
  - (d) meetings schedule;
  - (e) performance monitoring framework and participatory evaluation framework;

- (f) draft action plan; and
- (5) projects and activities being delivered.

**Area Partnership Budget 2017/18 - Applications for funding dealt with etc.**

7 With reference to the minutes of the Council's Executive Committee of 1<sup>st</sup> June 2017 approving an allocation of £60,351 to the Calton Area Budget 2017/18, there was submitted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council advising of the current position in relation to the Calton Area Budget 2017/18 and detailing a number of applications for funding.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted that to date £55,459 had been allocated to various projects in the Calton Ward;
- (2) dealt with the applications for funding as follows, the grant awards being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:-

### **Area Budget 2018/19 noted.**

**8** There was submitted a report by the Council's Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council, advising of funding allocations for 2017/18 approved by the Executive Committee on 1st June 2017 and detailing information regarding travel passes and playschemes within the Ward area.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted
  - (a) the Area Budget allocations for 2018/19 were subject to Glasgow City Council approving its budget for 2018/19 and that any revisions to current levels of budget would be subject to a future report;
  - (b) the interim arrangements which enabled the allocation of a portion of the funding from 2018/19 IGF Area Budget in January/February cycle of the 23 Area Partnerships for time critical applications;
  - (c) that time critical awards of up to £500 could be allocated from the 2018/19 budget under the existing delegated authority arrangements; and
  - (d) any IGF area budget awards made from 2018/19 budget were made subject to IGF available finances;
- (2) in terms of the Travel Pass Scheme, approved the provision of issue of travel passes for use during the school holiday periods to eligible organisations within the Ward area, subject to consultation with the Chair and details of the organisations would be provided to the Partnership at the next meeting; and
- (3) agreed that the Spring holiday playscheme awards be considered under delegated authority with the remaining playscheme award for, summer and October holiday periods being considered at the meeting of this Partnership in April 2018.
