

**CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.**

Minutes of the meeting held on 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2017 at the City Chambers, Glasgow.

**Minutes of previous meeting approved.**

**1** The minutes of 16<sup>th</sup> August 2017 were submitted and approved.

**Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework – Membership update noted.**

**2** There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing an update regarding membership of this Partnership, advising that

- (1) Archie Curran had now resigned as the representative for Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and had been replaced by Paul Tyrrell;
- (2) Linda Pike was the representative for Bridgeton and Dalmarnock Community Council with Nancy Humphries as the substitute representative;
- (3) Robert McLeish was the representative for Calton Community Council with Mairi Robertson as the substitute representative; and
- (4) Valerie McNeill was the representative for Gallowgate TRA with Marion Copeland as the substitute representative.

### **Environmental Task Force Activity report noted etc – Request to Acting Director of Land and Environmental Services.**

**3** There was submitted a report by the Director of Community Safety Glasgow regarding the Environmental Task Force (ETF), advising

- (1) that the Task Force had been launched in June 2016;
- (2) of the aims and objectives of the ETF within the Calton Ward, as detailed in the report;
- (3) of the ETF activity report for the period April 2017 to September 2017, as detailed in the report;
- (4) that Dalmarnock Primary School had signed up to the School's Charter and had now completed 3 events and would now receive their school certificate and trophy; and
- (5) of the regular clean ups that had taken place at the Elcho Gardens area and the partners involved in carrying these out.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report; and
- (b) requested the Acting Director of Land and Environmental Services to investigate the build up of excess leaves blocking drains on Bellfield Street.

### **Multi Member Ward Plan Update noted.**

**4** There was heard a verbal report by Inspector John Gormlie, Police Scotland, advising the Partnership of the current progress that Police Scotland was making within the Ward and of the current statistics in relation to crime and anti-social behaviour within the Ward.

After consideration, the Partnership noted the report and requested that Inspector Gormlie pass on their gratitude to his colleagues for the excellent work that they had carried out within the Ward.

### **Scottish Fire and Rescue Service Ward Update noted – Request to the Chief Officer, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service.**

**5** There was heard a verbal update by Mr Scott Murray, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service, advising the Partnership of the current issues, incidents and work being carried out within the Ward within the last 3 months.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the update; and
- (2) requested the Chief Officer, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service to liaise with Police Scotland, to investigate whether there was sufficient access to Whitby Street and the streets within Athlete's Village, Dalmarnock for emergency services vehicles.

### **City of Glasgow Local Fire and Rescue Plan Consultation Process – Presentation by Chief Officer, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service noted.**

**6** There was heard and noted a presentation by the Chief Officer, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service, regarding the Local Fire and Rescue Plan Consultation process, advising

- (1) that a consultation by Scottish Fire and Rescue Service had been conducted to gather responses regarding its Local Fire and Rescue plan;
- (2) of the various consultation questions;
- (3) of the local and national overview of the Service including budget, management structure, local context and priorities;
- (4) of the Glasgow Plan's focus and priority areas; and
- (5) that the consultation process had concluded on 10<sup>th</sup> December 2017.

### **Area Partnership Budget 2017/18 - Applications for funding dealt with etc.**

**7** With reference to the minutes of the Council's Executive Committee of 1<sup>st</sup> June 2017 approving an allocation of £60,351 to the Calton Area Budget 2017/18, there was submitted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council advising of the current position in relation to the Calton Area Budget 2017/18 and detailing a number of applications for funding.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted
  - (a) that to date £40,106 had been allocated to various projects in the Calton Ward;
  - (b) applications dealt with under delegated authority, as detailed in the report; and
  - (c) dealt with the applications for funding as follows, the grant awards being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:-
