

**Environmental Task Force activity report noted etc - Requests to Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability and Director of Community Safety Glasgow.**

5 There was submitted a report by the Director of Community Safety Glasgow and the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability regarding the newly established Environmental Task Force (ETF), advising

- (1) that the Task Force had marked a new approach to service delivery which encouraged integrated working across a range of Council Family services under a common theme;
- (2) of the aims and objectives of the ETF within the Springburn/Robroyston Ward, as detailed in the report; and
- (3) of the ETF activity report for the period April 2017 to January 2018, as detailed in the report.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report;
- (b) requested the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability to
  - (i) review the number of bins and their placements in Eastfield Park, Hawthorn Street, Springburn Road and Fernbank Street;
  - (ii) investigate overgrown hedges at Zena Street/Olive Street that are encroaching on to the pavement;
- (c) requested the Managing Director of Community Safety Glasgow liaise with other agencies with regard to the removal of chewing gum, particularly around Springburn Shopping Centre; and
- (d) raised concerns with regard to anti-social behaviour on Lenzie Way and Lenzie Terrace whilst noting that Police Scotland had requested Partnership members to encourage the community to report any disturbances to the Police to investigate and take action as appropriate.
