

**CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.**

Minutes of the meeting held on 22nd August 2018 at the City Chambers, Glasgow.

**Minutes of previous meeting approved.**

1 The minutes of 25<sup>th</sup> April 2018 were submitted and approved.

**Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework – Membership update noted.**

2 There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing an update regarding membership of this Partnership, advising that

- (1) Melodie Crumlin was now the new representative for the Voluntary Sector Networks (in conjunction with the Third Sector);
- (2) steps had been taken to lift the suspension and re-establish Calton Community Council; and
- (3) West of Scotland Housing Association Tenants Advisory Group had met on Monday, 6<sup>th</sup> August 2018 and had nominated a representative to replace Anne Young, which would be reported to the next meeting of the Partnership.

**Zambia Missionary Teaching Experience – Presentation noted.**

3 There was heard and noted a presentation by Martin Mann, St Mungo's Academy regarding the pupils Zambia Missionary Teaching Experience trip.

## **Roads Investment Strategy 2018/19 noted – Request to the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability.**

**4** There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability regarding the Roads Investment Strategy 2018/19, advising of the

- (1) investment breakdown for roads and footways 2018/19; and
- (2) streets identified for carriageway/footway schemes, within the Ward as part of the 2018/19 strategy.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report;
- (b) requested the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability to
  - (i) liaise with the Executive Director of Development and Regeneration Services to investigate problems with drainage on Helenvale Street, Burgher Street, Parkhead Cross and along Duke Street at the junctions with Bellfield Street, Thomson Street, Garfield Street and Hillfoot Street;
  - (ii) include identified potential carriageways and footways schemes for inclusion in the 2<sup>nd</sup> tranche of the resurfacing programme, namely:-
    - (A) Mackeith Street – footway and carriageway;
    - (B) Millroad Street, Millroad Drive and Duke to Parkhead Cross – footways.

## **Area Partnership priority theme noted etc.**

**5** There was heard a report by the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities detailing the findings of a recent survey to establish the Partnerships priority theme.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the report; and
- (2) agreed that social isolation will be the priority theme for this Partnership.

### **Multi Member Ward Plan noted.**

**6** There was heard a report by Inspector John Gormlie, Police Scotland, advising the Partnership of the current progress that Police Scotland was making within the Ward and of the current statistics in relation to crime and anti-social behaviour, housebreaking, drug use/dealing and flytipping.

After consideration, the Partnership noted the report and thanked Inspector Gormlie for the positive work that was being carried out in the Ward.

### **Scottish Fire and Rescue Service update noted – Request to the Chief Officer, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service.**

**7** There was heard a verbal update by Craig Carenduff, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service advising of current issues, incidents and work being carried out within the Ward, including fire safety visits and that CPR training was continuing to be rolled out in conjunction with the British Heart Foundation.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the report; and
- (2) requested that the Chief Officer, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service submit a report to a future meeting providing further information regarding hotspot areas.

### **Area Budget 2017/18 Annual Report noted – Request to Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities.**

**8** There was submitted a report by the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities providing a summary of the evaluation reports submitted by projects funded by the Area Budget in 2017/18, as detailed in the appendix to the report.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the report; and
- (2) requested the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities to include additional information in future annual reports on the allocation of the Area Budget with regards to investment priorities, community and voluntary groups, service departments and delegated authority.

## Area Budget 2018/19 - Applications for funding dealt with etc.

9 With reference to the minutes of 25th April 2018 when the Area Partnership noted that the Area Budget allocations for 2018/19 were expected to be confirmed in June 2018, there was submitted a report by the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities regarding the Area Budget 2018/19, advising

- (1) that the core allocations to the 23 Area Partnerships had been maintained at existing levels, which included an additional investment of £240,000 to 12 Area Partnerships based on the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation, following approval by the Council's City Administration Committee on 14<sup>th</sup> June 2018;
- (2) that Calton Area Partnership's Area Budget allocation for 2018/19 was £85,042; and
- (3) of applications for funding from the Area Budget 2018/19.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted
  - (i) the report;
  - (ii) that to date, £37,403 had been allocated to various projects in the Calton Ward, leaving a balance of £47,639;
  - (iii) the applications dealt with under delegated functions; and
- (b) dealt with applications for funding as follows, the grant awards being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:-
