1. Purpose

- 1.1 To present the draft Glasgow City Integration Joint Board Strategic Plan 2019-22, which is currently out for consultation.

2. Integration Joint Board Strategic Plan

- 2.1 Under the terms of the Public Bodies (Joint Working)(Scotland) Act 2014 and the Integration Scheme agreed by the Council and NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde in line with that Act, strategic planning for social care and community health services within Glasgow City is delegated to the Glasgow City Integration Joint Board.
- 2.2 The Integration Joint Board is required by statute to produce a Strategic Plan which outlines how the nine National Health and Wellbeing Outcomes will be met. This plan must cover a maximum of three years.
- 2.3 The Glasgow City Integration Joint Board's first Strategic Plan is effective to 31 March 2019, and therefore a new plan is required from 1 April 2019.
- 2.4 The draft Strategic Plan 2019-22 is currently out for consultation, and is presented to members for information.
- 2.5 The consultation will be carried out in line with the consultation plan agreed by the Integration Joint Board in August 2018 and which is available at <https://glasgowcity.hscp.scot/sites/default/files/publications/ITEM%20No%2007%20-%20Strategic%20Plan%20Consultation%20Update.pdf>
- 2.6 All consultation materials, including the opportunity to respond to the consultation, are available on the Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership website at <https://glasgowcity.hscp.scot/strategic-plan-consultation>
- 2.7 The consultation period will run to mid-January 2019, following which all feedback received during the consultation period will be analysed, and a final draft plan presented to the Integration Joint Board for consideration at their March 2019 meeting.
