

**CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.**

Minutes of the meeting held on 21st November 2018 at the City Chambers,  
Glasgow.

**Minutes of previous meeting approved.**

1 The minutes of 22nd August 2018 were submitted and approved.

**Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework – Membership update noted.**

2 There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing an update regarding membership of this Partnership, advising that Mary MacPherson was now the representative for the re-established Calton Community Council with Patricia Fort as the substitute representative.

**Clydesdale Amateur Rowing Club (CARC) – Presentation noted etc.**

3 There was heard a presentation by Miki Lee Dale, Clydesdale Amateur Rowing Club regarding the work and remit of the Club, advising

- (1) that their mission was to allow the wider community to enjoy and share the social, psychological and physical benefits of being part of a diverse river community;
- (2) of the aims and objectives of the Club;
- (3) of the activities that took place both in the water and in schools to encourage youth participation;

- (4) that often the lack of appropriate clothing was a barrier to participation and how the grant from this Partnership's Area Budget helped to buy appropriate clothing, which in turn helped reduce anxiety for young people and those who delivered service; and
- (5) that currently in the Ward there were 150 participants and through Partnership engagement CARC hoped that this would double in 2019.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the presentation;
- (b) asked various questions regarding the Club, which were duly answered by Miki Lee Dale; and
- (c) extended praise and thanks to the Club for the work that they were carrying out and hoped they would continue to expand.

**Reducing Social Isolation - Fostering Social Connections – Presentation noted – Request to Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities etc.**

4 With reference to the minutes of 22nd August 2018, when this Partnership agreed that social isolation would be a priority theme, there was heard a presentation by Suzie Heywood, Glasgow City Health and Social Care, advising

- (1) that social isolation and loneliness could affect anyone and was a major public health issue which could have a significant impact on a person's physical and mental health;
- (2) that the GoWell study found that poverty contributed to social isolation and that loneliness was highest amongst those who lived alone, middle aged men with low educational qualifications and those with mental health problems;
- (3) of the link between social isolation and premature death;
- (4) of the findings of the Health and Wellbeing Survey 2017/18;
- (5) of the various barriers to accessing services which included confidence, money, competing priorities, resources and trust; and
- (6) of the various ways to tackle social isolation including, reducing barriers to accessing services, regular and sustained support groups and projects which sought to improve social skills and enhance social support.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the presentation; and

- (b) requested the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities to arrange a meeting for interested members, prior to the next meeting of the Partnership, to discuss potential actions that the Partnership could undertake regarding this priority.

5 This item was withdrawn from the agenda for consideration at a future meeting.

### **Scottish Fire and Rescue Ward Statement 2018 – Update noted – Request to Chief Officer, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service etc.**

6 There was heard a verbal update by Craig Carenduff, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service (SFRS), advising

- (1) of the current issues, incidents and work being carried out within the Ward, including home fire safety visits, CPR training and unwanted fire alarms;
- (2) that on 5th November SFRS dealt with 531 incidents which included 224 bonfires and that anti-social behaviour remained an issue on Bonfire night; and
- (3) Scottish Fire and Rescue expressed their gratitude to all Partners involved on the night for their support and help.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the update;
- (b) requested the Chief Officer, SFRS to provide details of their engagement work with children and young people at schools and Third Sector youth organisations as part of future updates to this Partnership; and
- (c) expressed their gratitude to SFRS for the work that they continued to undertake in the Ward.

### **Area Budget 2018/19 – Current Position and Applications for funding dealt with etc.**

7 There was submitted a report by the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities regarding the Area Budget for 2018/19, advising

- (1) that Calton Area Partnership's Area Budget allocation for 2018/19 was £85,042; and
- (2) of applications for funding from the Area Budget 2018/19.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted
  - (i) the report;
  - (ii) the position regarding Area Budget allocations 2018/19;
  - (iii) the monitoring statement for 2018/19, as detailed in Appendix 1 to the report;
  - (iv) that to date, £68,760 (80.85%) had been allocated to various projects in the Calton Ward, leaving a balance of £16,282 (19.15%); and
  - (v) the ineligible application, as detailed in the report;
