

**CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.**

Minutes of the meeting held on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2018 at the City Chambers, Glasgow.

**Minutes of previous meeting approved.**

1 The minutes of 31<sup>st</sup> January 2018 were submitted and approved.

**Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework – Membership update noted – Request to Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council.**

2 There was submitted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing an update regarding membership of this Partnership, advising that

- (1) Robert McLeish had resigned as the representative for Calton Community Council;
- (2) James MacKenzie had resigned as the representative for Parkhead Community Council; and
- (3) Mary Campbell was now the representative for Calton Community Council.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report; and
- (b) requested that the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council write to West of Scotland Housing Association and ascertain if they wished to continue with representation on the Partnership as its representative had not attended the Partnership since 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2017.

### **Glasgow Community Planning Partnership – Governance Framework - Register of Interests noted.**

3 There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council advising the Partnership of the requirements in relation to the CPP Governance Framework regarding the registration and declaration of members' interests and detailing those interests which had been declared by members of the Partnership, as detailed in the appendix to the report.

### **Community Events Programme - Presentation noted.**

4 There was heard and noted a presentation by Rosemary Robertson, Thenue Communities, advising the Partnership of the Community Events Programme which it provided.

### **Environmental Task Force Activity report noted – Request to Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability and Director of Community Safety Glasgow.**

5 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability and Director of Community Safety Glasgow regarding the Environmental Task Force (ETF), advising

- (1) that the Task Force marked a new approach to service delivery which encouraged integrated working across a range of Council Family services to a common theme;
- (2) of the aims and objectives of the ETF within the Calton Ward, as detailed in the report;
- (3) of the ETF activity report for the period April 2017 to January 2018, as detailed in the report; and
- (4) that the Forge Shopping Centre janitors carried out litter picks in the shopping centre, the perimeter of the building including public footpaths, and that it also played an active part in supporting local community clean-up events and worked in partnership with local organisations.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report;
- (b) raised concerns regarding the ongoing issue of dog fouling in the Ward; and
- (c) requested the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability and the Director, Community Safety Glasgow to include in future reports more detailed information in regards to specific numbers of needles and sharps picked up and any hotspots in the Ward .

### **Multi Member Ward Plan - Update noted – Request to Chief Executive, Glasgow Life.**

6 There was heard a report by Inspector John Gormlie, Police Scotland, advising the Partnership of the current progress that Police Scotland was making within the Ward and of the current statistics in relation to crime and anti-social behaviour, housebreaking, drug use/dealing and flytipping.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the report;
- (2) thanked Inspector Gormlie for the positive work that was being carried in the Ward with noticeable improvements; and
- (3) requested that the Chief Executive, Glasgow Life liaise with Calton/Dennistoun/East Centre Hub Cap Representatives , Community Safety Glasgow and Children’s Neighbourhood Scotland to develop a proposal to tackle the large number of young people congregating at Bridgeton Community Learning Campus and Sacred Heart Primary School.

### **Multi Member Ward Update – Item Withdrawn.**

7 This item was withdrawn from the agenda.

### **Area Budget 2017/18 – Final monitoring statement noted.**

8 There was submitted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council regarding the area budget for 2017/18, providing a final monitoring statement in relation to projects previously funded.

After consideration, the Partnership noted the monitoring statement and that £60,351 had been allocated to various projects in the Calton Ward.

### **Area Budget 2018/19 – Applications for funding and travel passes dealt with etc.**

9 There was submitted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council regarding the Area Budget 2018/19

- (1) advising of the current position in relation to Area Budget allocations for 2018/19, following approval of the Council’s 2018/19 budget on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2018, with final allocations expected to be confirmed in June 2018; and
- (2) detailing applications for funding and travel passes from the Area Budget 2018/19.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted
- (i) the position regarding Area Budget allocations for 2018/19;
  - (ii) the ineligible application received;
  - (iii) that to date £718 had been allocated to various projects in the Ward;
  - (iv) the applications dealt with under delegated functions, for Spring Playschemes; and
  - (v) the provision of travel passes and Playschemes to out of school care organisations.
