PAYMENT OF THE SCOTTISH RECOMMENDED ALLOWANCE FOR FOSTERING TO PROVIDERS IN THE PURCHASED SECTOR

1. Purpose

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to update the City Administration Committee on the payment of the Scottish Recommended Allowance for Fostering to providers in the purchased sector.
- 1.2 As Integration Joint Board approval could not be obtained within the required timescale, and in view of the urgent requirement to make these payments, the Chief Officer and Chief Finance Officer was asked to approve the recommendations in the report under delegated powers on the grounds of urgency.

2. Background

- 2.1. In August 2023, Scottish Government introduced the Scottish Recommended Allowance (SRA) for foster and kinship carers.
- 2.2. This was to introduce a standard allowance to achieve a greater degree of consistency and transparency in allowance payments and information. It was also to ensure that children in foster and kinship care get the support they need to thrive, and ensure there is parity in the financial support provided to kinship and foster carers, regardless of where they live in Scotland.

3. Current Payments

- 3.1. Carers who are paid directly by Glasgow HSCP are in receipt of the SRA, however the issue of making payments to providers in the purchased sector was unclear and has been discussed widely nationally and with COSLA. These discussions have now concluded with the outcome that providers of purchased services should receive payment to enable them to pay the SRA.
- 3.2. Payment will be made to those providers who are currently paying foster and kinship carers below the SRA rate and this will be backdated to 1st April 2024. Providers will be required to provide evidence of current payment to carers and also evidence that payments are changed to reflect the new SRA rates and that this has been back dated to carers from 1st April 2024. This will also be monitored as part of contractual monitoring arrangements which are in place.
- 3.3. The current SRA rates are as follows:

Age of child	0-4	5-10	11-15	16+
SRA	£168.31	£195.81	£195.81	£268.41

3.4. This does not include contracts through Scotland Excel, as this is being dealt with directly, with an implementation date of 1st July 2024.

4. **Funding**

- 4.1 Funding has been provided by Scottish Government to make these payments, which forms part of the Children and Families budget.
- 4.2 The cost of the uplift is unknown as we need to engage with providers to understand what rates they currently pay as some pay above the SRA.
