### **Response to consultation on proposal to close Enhanced Vocation Inclusion Programme as a school and establish it as a service within Glasgow's Virtual School - Proposal approved.**

1 With reference to the minutes of 21st March 2024 (Print 1, page 35) approving the carrying out of a public consultation on a proposal to close the Enhanced Vocation Inclusion Programme (EVIP) as a school and establish it as a service within Glasgow's Virtual School, Councillor Cannon, City Convener for Education and Early Years, presented a report regarding the matter, advising

- (1) of the outcome of the consultation on the proposal and that of the 8 responses to the consultation, 5 were not in favour of the proposal and 3 were in favour of the proposal;
- (2) of Education Scotland's report on the proposal;
- (3) of the issues raised during the consultation and Education Services' responses; and

- (4) that it was proposed that the proposal to close the EVIP be implemented immediately as the EVIP was already working within Glasgow's Virtual School.

After consideration, the committee approved the closure of the Enhanced Vocation Inclusion Programme as a school and establish it as a service within Glasgow's Virtual School.
