Item 1 - Further question in relation to question and answers from meeting of 8th May 2024 in relation to Item 2 – Strategic Plan Performance – Grand Challenge 4	<p>Councillor Cecilia O’Lone:-</p> <p>Is the £5m of Glasgow City Council funding approved for George Square, the total cost for the project?</p>	Financial Services - Duncan Black
Answer	<p>The works to George Square are being developed as part of the City Deal Avenues (City Centre) project and therefore will include the works to surrounding streets. The cost for the project is yet to be finalised and will be determined through the procurement process, which is ongoing, with tender documentation being prepared.</p> <p>The latest position was reported to the Economy, Housing, Transport and Regeneration City Policy Committee on 4 June 2024. Further updates will be brought back to that Committee by NRS.</p>	
Item 2 – Strategic Plan Performance – Grand Challenge 4 – Commitment 3	<p>Bailie Patricia Ferguson</p> <p>In relation to the report on the proposed revised eligibility criteria for accessing Social Care support, what is the timescale for it being considered for approval by the IJB and the City Administration Committee?</p>	Chief Executive’s Dept - Michelle McGinty
Answer	<p>As a result of the pre-election period, a report on the proposed revised eligibility criteria for accessing Social Care support was delayed. An extraordinary IJB meeting has now been scheduled for 28th August 2024 and this is one of the items that will be discussed at that meeting.</p> <p>An IJB Development Session has been arranged the week prior to the 28th August IJB meeting and part of the purpose of the development session, where IJB Members will be briefed on the content of the report going to the IJB, is to establish if the IJB have any suggestions in relation to the proposals and therefore affect any subsequent governance requirements.</p>	

	<p>The position at present in relation to the work to review access to social care services is that there is no requirement/intention to take a report to CAC following the IJB as the proposals to be discussed with the IJB relate to social work practice not policy. At this stage it is not envisaged that a report on any revised eligibility criteria will require to be considered by the City Administration Committee.</p>
