

Planning Enforcement Charter - Statutory Review noted – Recommendation to City Administration Committee.

3 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability regarding a requirement through the Planning etc (Scotland) Act 2006 for the Council to produce a Planning Enforcement Charter every 2 years

- (1) advising that
 - (a) in order to guide the public on how councils set out their approach to dealing with breaches of planning control, the said Act required each Council to prepare a statement of its policy towards taking enforcement action and explaining how the public could participate in the process;
 - (b) the current Planning Enforcement Charter needed to be approved by the Scottish Government and made available to the public by 1st April 2024; and
 - (c) in updating the Planning Enforcement Charter, the Council was required to take into consideration any changes in legislation and circumstances which might affect how the Council delivered its planning enforcement service; and
- (2) detailing, in an Appendix to the report, the revised Planning Enforcement Charter.

After consideration, the committee

- (i) noted
 - (A) the terms of the Planning etc (Scotland) Act 2006 and the associated statutory obligations on the Council to produce an Enforcement Charter every 2 years; and
 - (B) the revised Planning Enforcement Charter 2024;
- (ii) recommended to the City Administration Committee approval of the revised Planning Enforcement Charter; and
- (iii) requested an electronic copy of the relevant housebuilders guidance for Glasgow.
