1. Introduction

- 1.1 The council's Standing Orders Relating to Contracts 2022 state that any contract awarded with an estimated value of £50,000 (excl. VAT) and above, but either below £500,000 (excl. VAT) (supplies/services), or below £663,540 (incl. VAT) (light touch regime services) or below £5,372,609 (incl. VAT) (works) shall be reported to the Contracts and Property Committee on a quarterly basis. Individual social care packages with an estimated value greater than £50,000 (excl VAT) will be included within this report as per Standing Order 16.6.
- 1.2 Appendix 1 sets out the contract/framework awards for the period 1st January to 31st March 2024 which have been approved by officers in line with the council's Scheme of Delegated Functions.
- 1.3 Appendix 1 has been updated to include contracts awarded via the Mini Competition B process from the council's Civils and Infrastructure Core Works Framework. This process was implemented to remove the administration burden for contractors, the CPU and service areas and to provide a quicker route to market for lower value works projects. The Mini-Competition B process is conducted for Civils and Infrastructure projects below lot specific value thresholds and is subject to the majority of the project scope/requirement being covered within the Framework schedule of rates. The contractors would be approached only to check on their capability and capacity to carry out the works and for them to provide pricing for any nonframework items that may be required. The recommended contractor for award of contract is determined by using the contractor's overall price (Framework rates plus non-framework items if required) combined with the quality and fair work first score as obtained when appointed to the Framework. The contractor with the best overall score is awarded the contract.
- 1.4 Each tender was managed by a commodity team consisting of a Corporate Procurement/Commissioning officer and relevant representative(s) from service areas or Arm's Length External Organisations (ALEOs). The commodity team is responsible for developing the sourcing strategy, if relevant, identifying the best route to market, appropriate tender evaluation methodology, including the price and quality ratio and percentage weightings of the evaluation sub criteria and the evaluation of the tender bid(s) relating to the contract or Framework Agreement.
- 1.5 Appendix 2 provides an extract from the Council Standing Orders Relating to Contracts 2022 to show the content of this report aligns to the delegated award and reporting levels that must be reported to Committee.

Note 1: GCC006028CPU - Of the 13 consultants appointed to lot 3, 1 submitted a bid and the remaining 12 consultants that failed to bid cited various reasons for not responding. The majority cited a lack of capacity due to other commitments and some consultants failed to respond to the clarification issued. The tender has resulted in a cost avoidance saving of £45,410.

Note 2: GCC005967CPU - All 5 suppliers appointed to Category 12 of the DPS were invited to submit a bid. 3 declined to respond and 1 did not reply. A saving of £2,019 over the duration of a 36-month contract should demand be consistent with historical volumes

Note 3: GCC005817CPU - Of the 4 suppliers invited, 1 submitted a bid. Of the 3 suppliers that failed to respond, none provided any feedback to detail the reasons for not submitting a response.

Appendix 2 – The Council Standing Orders Relating to Contracts 20022 (Extract)

Standing Order paragraph	Description
1.1.5	The Standing Orders shall not apply to any contracts made on behalf of the Council by Scottish Procurement, Scotland Excel or any other central purchasing body or procurement partnership with whom the Council has made arrangements for the award of works, supplies or services contracts on its behalf, save in respect of the reporting requirements prescribed in Standing Order 7.4.4.
7.4.4.1	Any contract awarded with an estimated value of £50,000 (excl. VAT) and above, but either below £500,000 (excl. VAT) (supplies/services), or below £663,540 (incl. VAT) (light touch regime services) or below £5,336,937 (incl. VAT) (works) shall be reported to the Contracts and Property Committee by the Executive Director of the Relevant Service (or the Chief Officer for contracts governed by Part III). A report shall be submitted to the Committee on a three-monthly basis.
7.4.4.2	Notwithstanding Standing Order 1.1.5, any participation agreement or call-off contract relating to Scottish Procurement national Category A commodities shall be reported to the Contracts and Property Committee by the Executive Director of the Relevant Service, irrespective of the estimated contract value.
16.6.6	Any Social Care Contract for the delivery of care packages to individuals assessed by the Chief Officer as having complex sensitive care requirements shall be excluded from these Standing Orders. The Chief Officer shall prepare and retain for audit purposes a written report recording, on an anonymised basis, the individual care requirements in each case, the reason(s) why the particular Provider was selected, and why the cost represented best value to the Council in the circumstances. The Chief Officer shall submit a report to the Contracts and Property Committee on a three-monthly basis containing this information in relation to any such contract awarded within that period.
