Glasgow Low Emission Zone Resource Allocation

Purpose of Report:

To provide Committee with an update on the utilisation of LEZ revenues allocated in the 2024-2027 budget to Community Climate Projects.

1 Background

- 1.1 GCC introduced Scotland's first Low Emission Zone (LEZ) in 2018 which targeted emissions from the bus fleet and required progressive improvements in the number of cleaner buses entering the city centre. However, extensive modelling of options highlighted that bus fleet improvements would not be sufficient on their own to achieve compliance with the air quality objectives in the city centre. The Glasgow LEZ was therefore expanded in scope to cover all other vehicle types.
- 1.2 The <u>LEZ final scheme design</u> was submitted to Scottish Ministers for final approval, which was received on 19 May 2022. The full Glasgow LEZ therefore came into effect on 31 May 2022, beginning a one-year grace period before general enforcement began on 1 June 2023.
- 1.3 Non-compliant vehicles entering the LEZ are subject to penalty charges set in Regulations. Penalty charges are set to discourage non-compliant vehicle entry through an escalating scale of penalty charge for repeated entry to the zone.

2 Use of Residual Revenue

- 2.1 Section 27 of the Transport (Scotland) Act 2019 states, "Any monies received from penalty charges in respect of a low emission zone scheme may be applied by the local authority only for the purposes of (a) facilitating (directly or indirectly) the achievement of the scheme's objectives".
- 2.2 Any income received through enforcement of the LEZ is firstly allocated to the costs of operating the scheme. Any residual revenue is allocated to the potential funding of projects which otherwise provide benefits in respect of the LEZ objectives.
- 2.3 The LEZ objectives are set out in the LEZ Scheme Design as follows:
 - Improve public health of residents of and visitors to the City of Glasgow by contributing towards meeting the air quality objectives prescribed under section 87(1) of the Environment Act 1999.
 - Contribute towards the emissions reduction targets set out in Part 1 of the Climate Change (Scotland) Act 2009 through the promotion of low and zero emissions vehicles and the promotion of public and sustainable transport options.
 - Improve the amenity of Glasgow through the promotion of the Glasgow City Council Strategic Themes of A Vibrant City, A Healthier City and a Sustainable and Low Carbon City.
- 2.4 Detailed financial reporting in terms of income from penalty charge notices and expenditure incurred in operation of the LEZ enforcement system for financial year 2023 / 2024 was reported to the Net Zero and Climate Progress Monitoring

- City Policy Committee in <u>August 2024</u>. This report set out the residual revenue available after non-grant funded operational expenditure.
- 2.5 Council Budget directed that £250k of 2023/24 LEZ revenues be allocated to tree planting activity in the city centre, with a further £250k allocated to broader climate action activity as outlined in the objectives in section 2.3.
- 2.6 The LEZ Annual Performance Report identified net revenue of £747,511 for financial year 2023 / 2024. However, back office and enforcement staff costs were fully funded by Transport Scotland grant and this funding is not available for subsequent financial years. Therefore, the residual £247,511 will be retained for future operational costs with any surplus allocated to the city greening / tree planting activities.

3 Greening the City / Tree Planting

- 3.1 As noted in section 2.5, a budget of £250K from the 2023/24 LEZ revenues was allocated to support workstreams in the 'Greening the City' programme. The funding will allow for more tree planting and greening projects, to be developed across the city. These projects will provide benefits in respect of improving air quality, local biodiversity and contribute towards Glasgow's aspirations of achieving the globally recognised status as a 'Tree City of the World'.
- 3.2 £165K of the LEZ fund has been allocated for the supply and installation of city centre trees in planters. A map of the proposed planter locations can be found in Appendix A. Additionally, GCC is investigating working with Trees for Streets, a charitable scheme from the national charity, Trees for Cities. This a Tree Sponsorship scheme that will allow GCC to work with a unique supplier to provide a full wrap-around service which includes promotion, marketing, engaging with residents, website management, data processing, crowdfunding, and donation collection for tree planting.
- 3.3 The trees in planters element of the project is currently out to tender and once complete will move to award and procurement of services. The arrangements in respect of the Trees For Streets element of the project has been approved by our legal and procurement depts with the intention to allocate the remainder of LEZ funding to this project.
- 3.4 'Greening the City' also includes other workstreams such as transformation of bus stop roofs into green roofs / bee stops and working with partner organisations to introduce innovative living / green walls and bee stops in the city. These workstreams may potentially further benefit from future LEZ funding, should this be available.

4 LEZ Funding - Objectives

4.1 Use of LEZ residual revenue for project support represents an opportunity to maximise the environmental, health, social and community benefits of the LEZ

- and allow for funding to be provided to groups and organisations which can deliver complementary projects across the city.
- 4.2 The Low Emission Zone Community Climate Project Support Fund will support groups that will deliver projects in relation to the objectives of the LEZ. Support is available across three broad themes in line with these objectives. Applications which provide benefits across multiple themes will be assessed more favourably should the Project Support Fund be over-subscribed. Applications are invited for projects which:
 - Contribute towards improvements in air quality and reductions in prescribed pollutant levels.
 - Contribute towards climate change emissions reduction or adaptation.
 - Improve the amenity of Glasgow or defined areas within the city, with an emphasis on the stated Strategic Themes A Vibrant City, A Healthier City and a Sustainable and Low Carbon City
- 4.3 Through this fund, project support will be available between the value of £20,000 and £50,000 per project. The minimum funding allocation has been set in order to ensure that the application, monitoring and compliance requirements are proportionate for the successful applicants and to provide projects with sufficient beneficial impact. The maximum funding allocation has been set in order to ensure that an appropriate range and scope of projects may be considered for funding within the total fund value.

5 Timeline, Process and Governance

5.1 Table 1 below provides an indicative timeline for the next steps for the Project Support Fund.

5.2 In common with similar GCC funding applications, it is intended that an online application portal will be established which will be accessible through the Council web site. Stakeholder information packs and application support will be available during the application period.

- 5.3 The fund will also be extensively promoted through the appropriate channels, including community engagement and written and social media. The establishment of the LEZ Project Support Fund represents a unique opportunity to further promote the benefits of the LEZ and inform the community that the benefits arising are not restricted to the main objective of improved air quality in the city centre.
- 5.4 Following initial assessment and technical and eligibility checks applications will be assessed by a panel of strategic lead officers from relevant service areas within the council family.
- 5.5 The assessment criteria will include:
 - Compliance with all eligibility requirements;
 - Alignment with the LEZ objectives and outcomes scoring will be weighted towards projects which provide benefits in relation to the first two of the three LEZ objectives and towards the geographic area of the LEZ;
 - Demonstration of need for project;
 - Ability to deliver outputs and outcomes within the fund's timescale;
 - Risk management; and
 - Value for money.
- 5.6 Where applications do not fully meet the required criteria or would benefit from advice and feedback from the assessment panel, this will be provided and where possible, a suitably modified application may be reassessed.
- 5.7 The assessment panel will prepare a report containing project funding recommendations for consideration by the Head of Sustainability. The recommended projects will then be submitted to the Climate Board for final approval.
- 5.8 Monitoring of the successful projects in respect of the terms and conditions of funding and the stated project milestones, will be undertaken by NRS Sustainability officers.
- 5.9 A draft application form is included in Appendix B to this report for consideration.

6 Next Steps

- 6.1 Finalisation of the application process, including all necessary procedural, financial and legal requirements, will be undertaken in advance of the launch of the application process.
- 6.2 Promotion, application support and a publicity program will also be prepared to support potential applicants throughout the process.

6.3 Following approval of the successful applications and award of grant funding, a paper will be prepared to provide Committee with information on the approved and funded projects.
