Glasgow City Heritage Trust and Glasgow Building Preservation Trust – Funding approved – Declaration of interest.

- 6 Councillor Kelly, City Convener for Neighbourhood Services and Assets, presented a report regarding proposed funding for the Glasgow City Heritage Trust (GCHT) and the Glasgow Building Preservation Trust (GBPT) for the financial year 2024/25, advising
- (1) that Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability (NRS) provided direct funding to GCHT and GBPT, with these 2 heritage organisations aiming to preserve, enhance and celebrate the city's historic environment and that both organisations had been identified as key contributors to the proposed Built Heritage Commission;
- (2) of the work of the GCHT which was an independent charity established in 2007 that delivered a city-wide grant programme to facilitate owners to restore the city's built heritage at risk and also provided a variety of outreach and heritage skills training programmes;
- (3) of the work of the GBPT which as an independent award-winning independent charity established in 1982 with a remit to address market failure by redeveloping historic buildings no one else can and reaching out to communities often left behind by traditional heritage approaches;
- (4) that NRS had provided £50,000 of core funding and £190,000 of grant funding to GCHT annually, which was in line with the Council's commitment to provide contributory funding to GCHT to augment Historic Environment Scotland's (HES) contribution of £857,950 of funding for 2024/25 and HES had confirmed support for a further 3 years from 2023-26 with a similar or enhanced contribution; and
- (5) GBPT had received funding of £50,000 each year from NRS to support core running costs and project development.

After consideration, the committee approved £240,000 of funding for the Glasgow City Heritage Trust and £50,000 of funding for the Glasgow Building Preservation Trust for the financial year 2024/25.

In terms of Standing Order No 27, Councillor Cunningham declared an interest in this item of business and left the room during its consideration.
