PROPOSED CHANGE TO PREVIOUSLY APPROVED GRANT FUNDED PROJECT – POSSILPARK PEOPLE'S TRUST COMMUNITY HUB

Purpose of Report:

- To inform committee of progress being made by Possilpark People's Trust to develop a new community hub facility at 130 Denmark Street, Glasgow.
- To advise of a change in approach to this project.
- To seek approval to re-commit the Council's capital contribution of up to £1.4m for this project.

1 Background

- 1.1. On 3rd June 2021, the City Administration Committee considered a request for grant funding of up to £1.4m (from the Council's Community Hubs Capital Fund) to be allocated to Possilpark People's Trust for the construction of a new Community Hub facility that was in development. The request was approved at this committee.
- 1.2. Subsequent to the aforementioned approval, final design development was completed, and the project was put out to tender.
- 1.3. Regrettably, the final landed tender costs indicated a project that was not affordable within the envelope of funding that had been secured at that point, and the contract was unable to be awarded.
- 1.4. Efforts were then undertaken to both reduce the overall cost of the project (by a value engineering exercise), whilst trying to identify additional funding that may have been able to fill the funding gap.
- 1.5. Despite these efforts, the project remained undeliverable within the secured funding available.
- 1.6. At that point, it was suggested that rather than continue to engineer the original project and look for additional funding, a project should be developed that could be delivered within the available funding. This would mean abandoning plans to demolish the existing building and construct a new hub, and focus on refurbishing and re-purposing the existing building.

2. Current Position

- 2.1. Possilpark People's Trust, along with their delivery partner HubWest have worked to develop a new proposal in line with the above and now have a refurbishment/repurposing option that they believe is deliverable within an affordability cap of £3,569,991
- 2.2. The table below illustrates the current funding schedule:

- 2.3. As demonstrated in the above table, a total funding package of £3,592,445 would be able to deliver the new refurbishment/repurposing project, however, would be contingent on GCC re-committing to the provision of their funding despite the change of scope for the project.
- 2.4. Other funders have already agreed to committing their funding to the new project, including RCGF funding from Scottish Government.
- 2.5. Despite the disappointment of being unable to deliver their aspirational new-build community hub, the Trust remains committed to delivering the outcomes contained in the original proposal and believe this remains possible in a refurbished/repurposed existing building.
- 2.6. Committee is being asked to approve that the funding that was originally committed to Possilpark People's Trust for the construction of a new Community Hub facility will remain available to the Trust to deliver their alternative project, on the basis that the outcomes achieved remain the same.
- 2.7 The Trust will also be required to submit an updated Community Asset Transfer request to reflect the change in project since the original request (which was for the construction of a new Community Hub) was approved. This will be considered in line with the Council's policy on CAT requests.
