

CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.

Minutes of meeting held on 3rd August 2016 in the City Chambers, Glasgow.

Additional items – Variation in the order of business.

- 1** The chair agreed to accept the following additional items as a matter of urgency
 - (1) Glasgow's Draft Housing Strategy 2017-2022; and
 - (2) Community Consultation: Roads Investment Strategy 2016/17.

Minutes of previous meeting approved.

- 2** The minutes of 18th May 2016 were submitted and approved.

Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework – Membership of Area Partnership – Update noted.

- 3** There was heard and noted a verbal update by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council, regarding an update to the membership of the Partnership, in terms of the Governance Framework, advising that Sergeant Alistair Lindsay had replaced Constable Ryan Anderson as the substitute member for Police Scotland.

Managing the Primary School Estate – Presentation noted.

4 There was heard and noted a presentation by Mr David McEwan and Mr Ian Robertson, Education Services, regarding a 10 year assessment being carried out by Education Services to identify supply and demand of primary schools within the Calton Ward.

Glasgow's Draft Housing Strategy 2017-2022 – Presentation noted.

5 As a matter of urgency there was heard and noted a presentation by Michelle Mundie, Development and Regeneration Services regarding Glasgow's Draft Housing Strategy 2017-2022, advising

- (1) that there was a 5 year plan for housing in Glasgow which would cover all types and tenures of housing to set out a vision and strategic direction for housing;
- (2) that the 1st draft consultation had been undertaken over the past few years but in order to properly reflect views a 2nd draft consultation would take place in September 2016 with a final version submitted to the Scottish Government by the end of 2016;
- (3) of the key issues and changes for housing in Glasgow;
- (4) of the 10 strategic priorities; and
- (5) that responses to the consultation document were requested by close of business on Friday 19th August 2016.

Equality in Progress Programme – Presentation noted.

6 There was heard and noted a presentation by Ms Rachel Thain-Gray, Glasgow Women's Library regarding the Equality in Progress Programme, In Her Shoes, advising

- (1) that the main focus of the programme was to look at hate crime experiences of women in Glasgow;
- (2) of the 4 partners involved and of the social identity groups identified;
- (3) that third party hate crime reporting must be encouraged; and
- (4) of upcoming events.

Roads Investment Strategy Community Consultation 2016/17 – Presentation noted etc.

7 As a matter of urgency there was heard a presentation by Mr E Shannon and Mr C Stewart, Land and Environmental Services regarding the community consultation on the Roads Investment Strategy 2016/17 advising of the carriageway resurfacing scheme scheduled to be undertaken within the Ward.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted the presentation; and
- (2) raised concerns regarding
 - (a) flooding at bus stops on Duke Street where bus elevation kerbs had been installed;
 - (b) flooding on the roads outside St Mungo's Academy; and
 - (c) the condition of footways in the Parkhead area.

Community Budgeting - Progress noted etc.

8 With reference to the minutes of 18th May 2016 when the Partnership heard an update on the community events held within the ward as part of the community budgeting programme, there was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing an evaluation of the impacts of the exercise and reflecting on options for further development.

The Partnership also heard and noted a verbal presentation by Ms Arlene Cook and Ms Donna MacLean, North Glasgow Healthy Living Community providing feedback on the Eating and Dancing around the World community project.

Neighbourhood Management - Anti-social behaviour update noted.

9 With reference to the minutes of 3rd December 2014, when the Partnership agreed the short/medium and long term outcomes, actions, timescales and Area Partnership leads for the Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan (ASB), there was submitted and noted a report by the Chief Constable, Police Scotland advising of the progress made in relation to the anti-social behaviour outcomes, as detailed in the report.

Integrated grant fund review: Area budget update noted.

10 There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing the Partnership with an update on the Integrated

Grant Fund Review Area Budget which came into effect for area budget applications received after 1st August 2016, as detailed in the report and attached appendix.

Area Budget 2016/17 – Applications for funding approved.

11 There was submitted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council detailing applications for funding from Calton Area Budget 2016/17.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted that to date, £36,090 had been allocated to various projects in the Calton ward leaving a balance of £29,170; and
- (2) dealt with the applications for funding as follows, the grant awards being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:-
