## **1. Background**

- 1.1 The Governance Framework for the Glasgow Community Planning Partnership structures sets out a key role for the Area Partnerships which includes the following:-

To co-ordinate the development and implementation of electoral ward level Neighbourhood Management action plans which respond to local needs and opportunities.

- 1.2 As part of developing a ward Neighbourhood Management Action Plan, the Area Partnerships identified a key priority of crime with a focus on anti-social behaviour.
- 1.3 In order to drive this agenda, the Calton Area Partnership considered reports at recent meetings. The report at the last meeting of the Area Partnership provided an update on the Anti-Social Behaviour outcomes.

## **2. Calton Area Partnership Anti-Social Behaviour Outcomes**

- 2.1 At the meeting of the Area Partnership on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2014, the Partnership agreed the short/medium and long term outcomes, actions, timescales and Area Partnership leads for the Anti-Social Behaviour Action Plan.
- 2.2 A summary of the progress made by the Partnership in relation to the agreed outcomes since the last meeting is detailed below:-

### **Reduction in loitering/Increase feeling in community safety**

There are no further requirements for updates concerning this area of the Action Plan as it will be covered in the multi-member ward plan update provided by Police Scotland.

### **Reduction in misuse of vacant and derelict land**

#### *Neighbourhood Management Meeting*

Meeting convened on 15<sup>th</sup> November 2016 and attended by colleagues from Land and Environmental Services (Cleansing and Landscape Design), and Community Safety Glasgow to discuss the timetable for the improvement works at Glenpark Street, Glendale Street, Millerston Street and Duke Street and department/partner responsibilities.

#### *Timetable*

Improvement works to begin week commencing 28<sup>th</sup> November 2016 and should last approximately 3 – 4 weeks. This is a suggested timetable as the works will be dependent on weather conditions, resources/equipment and staff available as most of the work is being carried out in-kind.
