

CALTON AREA PARTNERSHIP.

Minutes of the meeting held on 29th January 2020 at Kilbirnie House, Glasgow

Present: Councillor Greg Hepburn (Chair), Councillor Robert Connelly, Councillor Jennifer Layden and Councillor Cecilia O’Lone, Glasgow City Council; John Ferguson, Parkhead Community Council; Valerie McNeill, Gallowgate Transformational Regeneration Area; Margaret Storrie, West of Scotland Housing Association; and Paul Tyrrell, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service.

Minutes of previous meeting approved.

1 The minutes of 20th November 2019 were submitted and approved.

Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Governance Framework – Membership update noted.

2 There was submitted and noted a report by the Council’s Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council regarding the membership of this Partnership, advising that

- (1) Paul Tyrrell had replaced Stephen McGrath as the new representative for Scottish Fire and Rescue Service;
- (2) Chris Firth had replaced Paul Tyrrell as the new substitute for Scottish Fire and Rescue Service; and
- (3) Kelly Glass had resigned as the representative for Glasgow Third Sector Interface Network.

Gaelic Medium Education Consultation noted etc.

3 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Education Services, regarding the provision of a new Gaelic Medium Education Primary School, advising

- (1) of proposals for the development of a 4th primary school within the North East area of the city in the former St James’s Primary School building;

- (2) that it was proposed that this establishment would become a school in its own right;
- (3) of the current position regarding the consultation process which to date had received 196 positive responses and at the end of the consultation all responses would be considered and a decision made;
- (4) of the educational benefits to children, parents, carers and the local community; and
- (5) that if the proposals were agreed the timescale would be planned and developed in partnership with Glasgow City Council and the Scottish Government, who were supportive of the development.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report; and
- (b) welcomed the proposals and asked questions that were addressed by Ms Maureen McKenna.

Mini Mentor Project - Presentation noted etc.

4 There was heard a presentation by Ms Rohanna Irvine, Scottish Sports Futures advising that

- (1) the project used the power of sport to inspire young people to make positive lifestyle choices across the East End of Glasgow;
- (2) the purpose of the project was to up-skill 10 local young people to become mentors for other young people providing them with bespoke training;
- (3) the Active East Mini Mentors delivered 4 'monthly mingles' for young people covering topics such as; mental health, the power of sport, volunteering training and volunteering induction sessions; and
- (4) 10 young people from the Calton Ward were supported with their personal development, helping them to complete qualifications and complete personal development plans.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted and thanked Ms Irvine for the presentation; and
- (b) agreed that the power-point presentation would be circulated to all members for information.

Reducing Social Isolation priority discussion – Request to Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities.

5 With reference to the minutes of 20th November 2019, when the Partnership requested the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities to arrange a meeting with community facility staff to understand the reasons why there was a lack of service provision at the weekend, in relation to the format of information available within the Ward that adults 25+ years old could access, the Partnership heard a verbal update by Andrew McMillan, Community Empowerment Services.

After discussion and consideration, the Partnership

- (1) agreed the launch of the Socially Connected initiative, with leaflets and posters being circulated to a number of stakeholders to spread the information as wide as possible and that this would be the first phase of this initiative, with phase 2 being a more targeted approach;
- (2) noted the various reasons for the lack of service provision at the weekend which included funding, staffing and self-generating income;
- (3) welcomed the launch of the Socially Connected initiative; and
- (4) requested that the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities contact Housing Associations to ascertain their community input beyond housing and any engagement that they had undertaken to determine demand for adult provision in the evening and weekends.

Police Scotland Ward update – Item Withdrawn.

6 This item was withdrawn from the agenda for consideration at a future meeting.

Scottish Fire and Rescue Service – Ward update noted.

7 There was submitted and noted a report by Paul Tyrrell, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service, advising the Partnership of the current issues, incidents and work being carried out within the Ward for the period 1st October to 31st December 2019.

Area Budget 2019/20 – Current Position and Applications for Funding dealt with etc.

8 There was submitted a report by the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities regarding the Area Budget for 2019/20, advising that the Calton Partnership's Area Budget allocation for 2019/20 was £99,046.33 and following the allocation of additional funds of £47,895 by the North East Sector Community Planning Partnership at its meeting on 27th November 2019, the Calton Area Budget for 2019/20 was now £146,941.33.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (1) noted
 - (a) the Area Partnership's Area Budget for 2019/20;
 - (b) the ineligible applications, as detailed in the report;
 - (c) the returned funds from Friends of the People's Palace, Winter Gardens and Glasgow Green and Glasgow Youth Council, which were available for reallocation;
 - (d) the applications dealt with under delegated functions, as detailed in the report; and
 - (e) the current Area Budget position for 2019/20; and

Area Budget 2020/21 - Applications for Funding dealt with etc

9 With reference to the minutes of the Council's City Administration Committee of 29th August 2019 approving the proposed budget for the Glasgow Communities Fund for the next 3 financial years, including funding for Area Partnerships with an assumption that the total allocation to Area Partnerships was maintained at least at 2019/20 levels, there was submitted a report by the Council's Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities regarding the Area Budget for 2020/21, advising

- (1) of the current Glasgow City Council budget position in relation to Area Budget allocations for 2020/21;
- (2) that the Calton Area Partnership's Area Budget proposed allocation for 2020/21 was £99,046.33;
- (3) of the applications for funding from the Area Budget 2020/21, as detailed in appendix 1;
- (4) of the applications for playscheme funding, as detailed in appendix 2 to the report; and

- (5) of the applications for travel pass scheme, as detailed in appendix 3 to the report.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted
- (i) that the Glasgow Communities Fund was subject to the Council setting its budget and was therefore still to be agreed and that any revisions to Area Partnership allocations for 2020/21 would be detailed in a future report;
 - (ii) the interim arrangements which enabled the allocation of a portion of the funding from the 2020/21 Area Budget in the January/February cycle for time critical applications;
 - (iii) that time critical awards of up to £500 could be allocated from the 2020/21 budget under the existing delegated authority arrangements; and
 - (iv) that all funding awards made in the January/February 2020 cycle of meetings and via delegated authority from the 2020/21 Area Budget would be subject to available finances;
- (b) dealt with the applications for funding as follows, the grant award being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:-
