

**NORTH EAST SECTOR COMMUNITY PLANNING PARTNERSHIP'S MINUTES.**

Minutes of meeting held on 25th November 2020

**Approval of substitute.**

**1** In terms of the Governance Framework, in the absence of representation from Glasgow Colleges, the Chair approved the attendance of Tracy Leavy to represent it at today's meeting.

**Minutes of previous meeting approved.**

**2** There was submitted and approved the minutes of 11th September 2020, with the Partnership noting that a detailed response to the questions raised in relation to the communities fund would be distributed among the members.

**Glasgow North Strategic Development Framework - Presentation noted.**

**3** There was heard and noted a presentation by Jim Corbett and Andrew Corletto, Development and Regeneration Services, regarding the Glasgow North Strategic Development Framework (SDF), advising

- (1) that SDFs were required by the Glasgow City Development Plan 2017 and that the Glasgow North SDF was the 4th to be prepared;
- (2) of the purpose of the SDF, which was to set out spatial principles to guide development over the next 30 years to inform local initiatives and development proposals, and that a 10-year action programme had been developed;

- (3) that local, Council and partner agency initiatives would drive the progression of the action plan,
- (4) of the overall outcome to create thriving, sustainable neighbourhoods that supported healthy living; and
- (5) of the current stage of the SDF that entailed a public consultation from 1st October 2020 to 29th January 2021, which was an opportunity for the public to comment and help shape the Glasgow North SDF, together with the next steps along with an indicative timeline for each stage.

#### **Scottish Fire and Rescue Service quarterly 2 update noted etc.**

**4** There was submitted and noted a report by Scottish Fire and Rescue Service (SFRS) providing information to the Partnership on the current issues, incidents and work being carried out in the North East Sector for the period from 1st July to 30th September 2020, advising

- (1) of a summary of their priorities and current activity for each of the wards within the North East Sector;
- (2) that there had been a decline in most activity due to the consequences of the coronavirus;
- (3) that the number of home fire safety risks had reduced significantly due to the pandemic, however all high risk cases which had been raised had been accommodated;
- (4) that there had been a substantial rise in activity on bonfire night, mainly attributed to the fact that no organised displays were able to go ahead; and
- (5) that regrettably one fire fatality had been recorded over the last 5 days.

#### **Review of Sector and Area Partnerships noted.**

**5** There was submitted a report by the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities providing an update on the progress and next steps in relation to the review of Sector and Area Partnerships, advising

- (1) that the report provided an update on the progress of the review, summarising the findings from the different stages of the review, and offered members an opportunity to comment on the draft recommendations that had emerged and to point to the next stages of the review process;
- (2) of the background and context of the review, the objectives, the key themes from the consultation, the impact that the COVID-19 pandemic had on the review and the subsequent virtual meetings of the Sector and Area Partnerships;

- (3) of the draft recommendations, which should not be viewed in isolation as each recommendation would be impacted in some way by other recommendations;
- (4) of the other factors to be considered and explored, including the Social Recovery Taskforce, community engagement, the importance of digital inclusion and consultation on the recommendations that arose from the Review of Locality Planning in Glasgow; and
- (5) that it was hoped that final recommendations would be available in early 2021.

After consideration, the Partnership noted

- (a) the report and the progress to date; and
- (b) that all feedback and comments should be submitted to Mr Derek Speirs by members and Community Councils before the end of December 2020.

#### **Glasgow's Social Recovery Task Force – Update noted.**

6 There was heard a verbal report by Mr D Speirs, Community Empowerment Services, regarding the Social Recovery Taskforce, advising

- (1) that the taskforce was established as a vital component of the Council's Renewal Programme Strategy and Governance Framework;
- (2) that the role of the taskforce was to provide leadership and direction, and to set out a shared vision that would drive the city's response to the impact of the Coronavirus in relation to a broad range of themes; and
- (3) of the membership of the taskforce, which was wide ranging and drew extensively, though not exclusively, from partners on the Glasgow Community Planning Partnership (GCPP) Strategic Partnership and the GCPP Executive Group.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) agreed that regular updates would be a standard item for future meetings of the Partnership; and
- (b) acknowledged that a more detailed report would be submitted to the next meeting of the Partnership and that if it was established that there were gaps in the membership of the task force from Sector Partnerships, that representations would be made to have members of the Partnership represented on the task force.

**Minutes of Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Strategic Partnership noted.**

**7** The minutes of the Glasgow Community Planning Partnership Strategic Board of 10th December 2019 and 18th February 2020 were submitted and noted.
